This year, JFF will be held on a much larger scale in more cities across India, namely Delhi, Gurugram, Chennai, Guwahati, Bengaluru, Mumbai, and Kolkata, from September until February 2020. We will show 25 of the most popular Japanese films from all genres, most of which were released in Japan this year or 2018. I would like to express my heartfelt appreciation to the Japan Foundation and all the people, both in India and Japan, who made holding of this excellent event possible this year.

Ever since I assumed charge as the Ambassador of Japan in India in 2015, I have been working hard to introduce various aspects of Japan to as many Indian people as possible, across the country. From the films which the Japan Foundation has brought to you this year, you will discover what Japanese people laugh at, what they are moved by, and what they like, etc. I hope that, through these interesting stories, you will feel closer to Japan and Japanese people. I wish JFF an even greater success this year. I am sure this film festival will help further consolidate the friendship between the people of our two countries.

## Welcome to JFF India!

It is with great pleasure that we introduce these specially curated New Japanese films in the Festival. As the Japan Foundation New Delhi is the only overseas office of the Tokyo-based Foundation in South Asia, we have been conducting Japanese cultural introduction programs in India with the goal of developing mutual understanding between our two nations. As you all know, films are an effective medium for introducing the culture of a country. In India, where cinema is the king of entertainment, we believe films would be more impactful in this intercultural engagement. While we have been consistently screening classic and contemporary Japanese films in India at the Foundation, it has been difficult to deliver the latest films to many people due to copyright and technical issues, until recently. By using the JFF platform, we can now screen the latest high-quality Japanese films. Our partnership with PVR has greatly enhanced our ability to start this new style of the Japanese Film Festival. In this mode, Japanese films can be delivered not only to some Japanese fans but also to general film audiences in India. Since we were able to achieve promising results in the first and second years, this year we were able to plan the Festival on an unprecedented scale.

The Japanese film industry is entering a new era. Young directors following in the steps of Akira Kurosawa, Yasujiro Ozu, Hayao Miyazaki, Takeshi Kitano and other stalwarts, are producing several accomplished works. Please come to see their work at the theater. Our goal is to eventually bring Japanese films to Indian cinemas like the mainstream releases of Hollywood films, so that they may be seen by Indians as regularly. Fortunately, our efforts to connect Japanese and Indian filmmakers through JFF and screen films at the Festival are gradually coming to fruition. Until recently, Japanese films were never shown commercially in city cinemas, but the recent release of *Shoplifters* (2018) and the upcoming release of *Weathering with You* (2019) are signalling the dawn of a new era for our intercultural relationship. I hope this number will steadily increase as more Indian people become aware of the fun of watching Japanese films.

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This year, we would like to celebrate with you the biggest JFF ever to be held in India, covering 7 cities. India is undoubtedly one of the most important nations to Japan. In particular, India and Japan have enjoyed many years of friendship with one another, based on a strong foundation of cultural and economic ties.

Film is a medium that enables us to understand different cultures. Through its powerful storytelling and visual techniques, it has the ability to portray the real lives of real people living in different worlds. By effectively reaching out to a large audience, I believe that film has the power to bring together people from various backgrounds, thus deepening mutual understanding. Even though Japan is currently the third largest film market in the world, producing over 700 films each year, surprisingly, hardly any Japanese films are actually released overseas, especially in India.

With the aim of creating more opportunities for you to enjoy Japanese films as well as connecting the Indian audience with other Japanese film fans across the world, we launched the "JFF (Japanese Film Festival) Initiative" in 2016. Through this initiative, 14 countries, Australia, Brunei, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, Russia, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam, have been interlinked through a single network or a "platform", allowing more than 1 million Japanese film fans in the world to connect both online and offline.

Our online platform, the JFF Web Magazine (www. japanesefilmfest.org) provides worldwide JFF fans with a deeper insight into the wonderful world of Japanese cinema, is planning to offer more opportunities for you to see actual Japanese films directly through streaming service in the near future. Please sign in our Web Magazine now and connect into our online platform.

I hope you enjoy Japanse cinema in the biggest JFF ever!

There is a transition at play in the Indian film consumerism. In the ever-expanding circuit of international film festivals in India, the launch of indigenous and international streaming platforms, and the theatrical runs of indie or alternative films, the release of *Shoplifters* is a viable testimony to the recognition as well as sustenance of the growing demand for new, alternative, engaging and qualitatively superior content, especially among the millennials. Quite like the international film festivals abroad, Japanese films have always made their impact felt in curations at Indian film festivals. A growing, ardent and enthusiastic following of cinephiles and anime fans have thrived in India for years at festivals, comic cons, streaming websites, and other avenues of consumption and engagement. This consistent dedication opened up the avenue for Shoplifters to release in mainstream theatres and will lead to the first full-scale commercial release of a Japanese feature anime/film in mainstream theatres. Coming to PVR theatres across an unprecedented 20 cities in the October of 2019 is the widely celebrated director, Makoto Shinkai's highly anticipated film, *Weathering with You* (2019).


In the context of such a new and vital evolution in the presence of Japanese films in India, the unprecedented expansion of the Japan Foundation's film pilot project, the 3rd Japanese Film Festival in India (JFF-India) 2019–20 is not merely a logical, but also a welcome step forward. Focussing exclusively on new Japanese films from 2017–19, the Festival has curated a wide range of genres, ideas, and aesthetics across the 25 films on this year's line-up. The diversity of the curation is notable for its attempt to combine some of the most representative audiences of India — from anime and live-action adaptations to mainstream and genre entertainment, indie and arthouse styles from film festivals to award-winning hybrids. There is a film for everyone at JFF-India — whether a casual walk-in, an ardent fan or a serious cinephile.


The Festival will begin its six-month journey at PVR Select CITYWALK in Delhi, subsequently travelling to PVR cinemas in Chennai, Guwahati, Bengaluru, Mumbai, and Kolkata. With the exception of Guwahati which will have a special 3-day/8 films special run, the 6 metros will participate in a 10-day/25 films Festival from September 2019 – February 2020. Thousands of film-goers across these cities will have the opportunity to experience an eclectic cinematic experience of New Japanese Films at a cinema in their vicinity — ranging from Academy Award Nominee *Mirai* to box-office record smash hits like *Your Name* and *Kingdom*, edgy indie Sundance breakout *We Are Little Zombies* or the enthralling musical *Dance with Me*, the heart-wrenching dramas like *The House Where the Mermaid Sleeps* or soul-stirring songs on friendships in *Little Love Song*, the familial love of *Bento Harassment* or the existential sorrow of modernity in *12 Suicidal Teens*.

JFF-India is a significant cultural moment in what has been a historic year for Japanese films in India. The Festival embodies the arrival of a new wave of an exclusively Japanese cinematic cultural experience to India , advancing the intercultural relationships between the two nations into a dynamic future of exchange and understanding.

Naonori Matsudaira is an unfortunate lord who is forced to move across Japan, from west to east seven times, saddling him with the nickname "the vagabond lord." In the Edo period, it cost a fortune for a lord to transfer from one fief to another, and if the shogunate reduced the stipend as well, numerous samurai had to be released from service and were rendered master-less. The cruel stress of relocations takes its toll on Matsudaira, and he passes away. His mantle is forced upon the ineffectual and paralyzingly shy Shunnosuke Katagiri. A single mistake could lead to harakiri (ritual suicide). He gets help from his childhood friend Takamura, and advice from Oran, the beautiful but headstrong daughter of a former magistrate. This is the story of Shunnosuke's desperate attempt to survive his seemingly hopeless predicament with no manpower, no money, and no experience.


