Lynne Brindley

At the British Library the big news, of course, is the appointment of Lynne Brindley as Chief Executive to succeed Brian Lang, who steps down in May. Lynne, currently the Pro-Vice-Chancellor and University Librarian at the University of Leeds, where she has been since 1997, takes up her position at the beginning of July. She is the first professionally qualified librarian ever to be Chief Executive of the BL. In the 1980's Lynne headed the Chief

Executive's Office at the BL and, before going to Leeds, was Librarian and Director of Information Services at the British Library of Political and Economic Science at the London School of Economics.

Elsewhere at national level, the first round of appointments to the Museums, Libraries and Archives Council was announced in January by the Culture Secretary, Chris Smith. Loyd Grossman, Victor Gray, Karen Knight and Mark Wood were appointed members of MLAC for a term of four years. The MLAC, which replaces the Museums and Galleries Commission and the Library and Information Commission, is chaired by Matthew Evans and will become fully operational on 1 April 2000. Loyd Grossman is well known as a writer and, and is currently a commissioner for the Museums and Galleries Commission. He is the Chairman of the Campaign for Museums, Chairman of Museums and Galleries Month 2000, an English Heritage Commissioner, and Chairman of the Conservation Awards. Victor Gray is the Head of Corporate Records and Archives at N.M. Rothschild and Sons Limited and Chairman of the National Council on Archives and the National Networking Policy Group for Archives. Karen Knight is the Director of Reading Museums and Archive Service, and in 1999 was appointed to both the Heritage Lottery Fund Expert Panel, and to the Museum Association Ethics Committee. Mark Wood is Editor in Chief of Reuters Plc. He has also been Chairman of ITN since 1998, and is currently Chair of the Library and Information Commission.

In Ireland, **Brendan Teeling** took up the post of Assistant Director at An Chomhairle Leabharlanna (the Library Council) in mid February. Brendan was previously working in Dublin City Public Libraries.

In UK government department libraries, Margaret Aitchison moved in January from the Department of Trade and Industry to take up a post in the Radio Communications Agency, where she is involved with radio band for e-commerce. Margaret had been Acquisition Services Manager at the Central

Acquisitions Unit of DTI since the unit was formed. Temporarily replacing Margaret is **Claire Meadows**, who for the past two years has been DataBase Editor working in Cataloguing and Indexing in Bibliographical Services at DTI.

At the Foreign and Commonwealth Office Library and Information Service, Diane Murgatroyd moved in January to become Information Manager in the Research Analysts Department, FCO. Diane was previously Assistant Librarian in the Purchasing Section of the Library and Information Services, FCO. Diane replaces John Wright who has moved to take up the Systems Manager post in LIS, FCO, replacing Maewyn Cumming, who left to take up a job with HMSO at the Cabinet Office.

There have been a number of changes at what used to be called the Health Education Authority and is now the Health Development Agency. The reorganisation is due to be completed in March. Melanie Taylor, who was the Librarian, went in December to the Institute of Personnel. Simon Frost has also left, having taken a job in the Housing Benefit Office in Poole. The interim Librarian, pending reorganisation, is Claire Bannon.

Last March, **Paul Woods** was appointed Librarian at the Inland Revenue – the first professional librarian to be appointed as a librarian as such in the Inland Revenue's 150 year history. Paul was formerly an Information Manager at

Department of Health's library at Skipton House.

In February Richard Searle retired as Chief Librarian for the Ministry of Defence. Graham Webster is Acting Chief Librarian pro tem. For the past year, Graham has been Assistant Director of MODWEB, the library's intranet. Samantha Watson has been promoted to Librarian and moved in January to the Home Office, where she is involved with the intranet. As an Assistant Librarian at MOD Samantha was part of the team that set up MODWEB.

In January Fiona Greig was promoted to Librarian and moved to DETR, the Department of Environment, Transport and the Regions, where she is Library and Information Centre Manager at Great Minster House. For the past four years, Fiona has been Deputy Information Scientist at MOD's Abbey Wood Information and Library Service.

**Sharon Beck** returned from maternity leave to DERA Winfrith as Team Leader. Her son Nathan is now eight months old.

In academic libraries, Anne Murray was appointed Deputy Librarian at Cambridge University and took up her new post in February. Anne was previously Sub Librarian Collection Development at Trinity College Dublin, a post she held from November 1998.

at University College Chichester.
