There have been a number of changes at the DSS library.
Senior Librarian **Graham Monk** has been promoted to the post of Head of Information, Library Service and Intranet. **Melanie Harris**, previously Legal Librarian at DSS is now on temporary promotion as Senior Librarian, Information and Library Services. **David Taylor**, who for the past 10 months has been

IIAC (Industrial Injuries Advisory Council) and Agencies Librarian at the DSS in London, has moved to Leeds to begin work on an audit of the DSS intranet site.

The Environment Agency has restructured its acquisitions procedures and has appointed a new team which has been in place from end July. Rebecca Cantwell is Acquisitions Officer responsible for subscriptions. Rebecca was formerly at the Kennel Club Library in London. Paul Harrington is now Acquisitions Assistant responsible for serials. Paul joined the team from the University of Oxford's Department of Zoology Library.
