At the British Library, change continues to be the order of the day. In February David MacArthur was appointed Head of Sales for the Library. David is charged with comprehensively refocusing sales in the library's document supply and bibliographic services, and will also play a key role in developing other products and services for the business and higher education sectors. David was formerly General Sales Manager at Raleigh Industries Ltd. In January, Heather Norman was appointed the first Head of Corporate and Public Marketing at the British Library. She joined from the Reuters Group where she was Publishing and Advertising Sales Director.

At the end of March Bruce
Madge (bruce.madge@bl.uk)
was appointed Product
Marketing Manager for
Business at the British Library
in Euston Road, where he is
responsible for developing
services for the corporate
sector. Bruce was formerly
Head of Health Care
Information at the British
Library. The BL will continue to
provide information on health
care through AMED and other
bibliographic products. With

the recent restructuring, this is now part of the library's bibliographic services based at Boston Spa. The Health Care Information Service will continue to be part of the new Science Technology and Innovation Department headed by Julia Stocken who took up her new post at the beginning of May.

In UK government department libraries, Gill Baker moved in January to the Department for Education and Skills as Senior Librarian on temporary promotion to cover maternity leave for Paula Collins. Gill is on secondment from the Department of Health where she had been Systems Librarian since 1994. Gill is responsible for overseeing a major library systems upgrade at DfES.

There are a number of other changes at the Department of Health. The Wellington House library was closed and merged in with the Skipton House library at the beginning of June. Lesley Vickers, formerly Librarian at the Wellington House library is now Customer Services Librarian at the Skipton House library, where she replaces Martin Gilbert. He moved to the Home Office

where he is currently Acquisitions Librarian until September when he takes up his post as Prison Services Librarian. Martin was Acquisitions Manager responsible for all journals acquisitions for the Department of Health for seven years until January when he became Customer Services Librarian at Skipton House. In March, Peter Baker moved from another section in the Department of Health's Information Services Group to become Head of Corporate Information Management and Web Development.

David Smith moved in March to become Head of Information Management Division at the Department for Transport, Local Government and the Regions. David was previously Head of Corporate Information Management and Web Development for the Department of Health.

From the Food Standards Agency, Helen Heathcote joined SIRSI UK as Customer Services Consultant in June. Helen had worked within MAFF (now DEFRA) and the Food Standards Agency for seven years. For the past two years she has been Systems Manager at FSA.

At Sussex University there are a number of changes. In July, Adrian Hale, took up the post up Library Resources Manager, moving from the Bodleian Library in Oxford. Also in July, Sally Faith joined the library as Administrative Officer, charged with oversight of matters accounting, financial and personnel matters and the library building itself. She was active in many committees including the London Universities Purchasing Consortium, where she was a member of a committee which looked at common supplies for library books and journals. Jane is planning to pursue an active retirement studying the romantic languages, travelling and cultivating her garden.

Naomi Patterson joined the staff of Southampton Institute Library in May as Assistant Acquisitions Librarian.

At the National University of Ireland Maynooth & St Patrick's College Maynooth, Anne Lordan was appointed as Library Assistant in the Periodicals Department in January. Anne worked previously for a Siemens company in Dublin as a PA.

In the health libraries arena, Jackie Lord, Librarian at the Royal College of Nursing, was elected Chair of the Health Libraries Group from the end of April. Jackie has taken over the Chair from David Stewart, Director Health Libraries North West who held the office for the previous three years. Jackie's term of office is due to run to the end of 2004.

Form the trade side of the information chain too comes news of changes. At Elsevier Science, Pascal van den Nieuwendijk has been promoted to Regional Manager in Singapore. Andy Crowther has replaced Pascal as Account Manager for the UK & Ireland. Andy joins from the Harcourt Sales team, which recently merged with Elsevier Science.

In May, Mark Simon joined Maney Publishing as Publisher. Mark was previously Editorial Director at Gordon & Breach (latterly Taylor & Francis) and prior to that had worked for Longman for nine years.

At Taylor & Francis, **David Smith** is the new chief

Meanwhile, in the camp of the agents, following divine Information Service's decision to consolidate its European customer service operations in its Paris office, announced on 11th April, divine's Oxford offices closed on 31st July. New customer service staff have been recruited in Paris to replace the Oxford team and are already managing some UK library accounts. Overseeing the transfer is the newly appointed UK Customer Service Manager, Robert Shepherd, who has made his home in Paris for several years since moving from his native Dover.

Sales/Account Management functions remain in the UK but will move from Oxford to divine's office in Windsor where they will be headed up by Michael Davis, recently appointed Sales Manager for divine Information Services in the UK. The majority of the rest of divine's UK staff were made redundant at the end of July.
