At the end of September, Professor F W Bullock stepped down as the Chair of trustees of the Laser Foundation, which he helped create. Professor Bullock had been Chair since the Foundation was set up in October 2001. The new Chair is **Bernard Naylor**, who was head of Libraries at Southampton University, and recently President of the Library Association, now the Chartered Institute of Library and Information Professionals (CILIP). Also retiring from the board is the biographer Michael Holroyd, who is replaced by H R Keating, representing the Society of Authors and Users of Public Libraries.
