The drugs which does the Karshana or Lekahan (Scraping) are called as Lekhana Dravyas. As per Acharya Charaka the drugs which produce lightness in the body known as Lekshana Karma. As per Acharya Sushruta these Lekhaniya drugs are predominant by Vayu and Agni Mahabhutas. The qualities of these drugs are; Laghu (Light), Ushna (Hot in potency), Teekshna (Penetrating and Sharpness action), Vishada (Clearness), Ruksha (Dryness), Sookshma (Minuteness), Khara (Roughness), Sara (Mobility), Kathina (Hardness). The Lekhaniya Dravyas are; Mustha (Cyperus rotundus Linn, Cyperaceae), Kustha (Saussurea lappa C.B clarke, Asteraceae), Haridra (Curcuma longa Linn, Zingiberaceae), Daruharidra (Berberis aristata Roxb.ex DC, Berberidaceae), Vacha (Acorus calamus Linn, Araceae), Ativisha (Aconitum heterophyllum wall. Ex Royle, Ranunculaceae), Katuki (Picrorrhiza kurroa Royle ex Benth, Scrophulariaceae), Chitraka (Plumbago zeylanica Linn, Plumbaginaceae), Chirabilva (Holoptelea integrifolia Planch, Ulmaceae), Shweta Vacha (Iris ensata Thumb, Araceae). These drugs help to increase the metabolism which help in utilizing the body fat and increasing the body vitality. These drugs also helps in the eliminating excess cellulite deposition, obstruction, blocks, clots, haematoma, obesity etc metabolic diseases from the body and prevent further disease pathogenesis.

INTRODUCTION

The Lehaniya drugs dissolves the accumulated excess Kapha in the Channels by scraping action. The word Lekha means carving on the stone. So it is termed as Utkeerna Lekha (Stone carving). The action is same on the body tissues. These drugs penetrate the tissues and scrape the unwanted and undigested toxins and expel out of the body. According to Sharangadhara Samhita^[1] the drugs which reduce or scrape away the unwanted tissues and metabolic wastes is known as *Lekhana*. Examples are Vacha (Acorus calamus Linn Araceae), Yava (Hordeum vulgare linn Poaceae), Madhu (Honey), Ushna Jala (Hot water). A Lekhana Drug is predominant by Vayu and Agni Mahabhuta. These drugs. [2] produces Laghuta (Lightness) in the body. The Langhana (Fasting Therapy) is the synonyms of *Lekhana*. The properties [2] of these drugs are; Laghu (Light), Ushna (Hot in potency), Teekshna (Penetrating and Sharpness action), Vishada (Clearness), Ruksha (Dryness), Sookshma (Minuteness), Khara (Roughness), Sara (Mobility), Kathina (Hardness). By these qualities these drugs can be advised in obesity, internal blockages, clots, drug induced obesity and metabolic disorders.

DISCUSSION

The Lekhaniya Dravyas^[3] are; Mustha, Kustha, Haridra, Daruharidra, Vacha, Ativisha, Katuki, Chitraka, Chirabilva, Shweta Vacha.

MUSTHA- (Cyperus rotundus Linn, Cyperaceae)^[4,5,6,7,8,9,10]

Musta is Katu (Pungent), Kashaya (Astringent), in taste, Hima (Cold in potency), Grahi (Absorbent), Tikta (Bitter), Dipana (Appetizer and digestive). It alleviates Kapha, Pitta and Rakta related diseases, Trishna (Thirst), Jwara (Fever), Aruchi (Distaste), Krimi (Worms), Atisara (Diarrhoea), Arsha (Haemorrhoids). Mustha Choorna is administered with milk cures nerve debility, menstrual problems, Daha (Burning sensation, Aruchi (Loss of taste), Rakta Vikaras (Bleeding disorders). The Musta Choorna, Devadaru, Vacha, Shunthi, Shodhita Ativisha together taken with warm water cures Amavata (Rhematoid arthritis).

KUSTHA - $(Saussurea\ lappa\ C.B\ clarke,\ Asteraceae)^{[11,12,13,14,15,16,17]}$

Kustha is Ushna (Heat), Katu (Pungent), Tikta (Bitter), Swadu (Sweet) in taste. Shukrala (Increases semen), Rasayana (Vitalizer), Laghu (Light), Vata and Kapha Shamaka (Subsides Vata and Kapha Doshas), Visarpa

(Herpes type of skin diseases), *Kasa* (Cough), *Visha* (Poison), *Kandu* (Itching), *Trishna* (Excessive thirst), *Kushta* (Skin diseases).

HARIDRA- (*Curcuma* longa Linn, Zingiberaceae)^[18,19,20,21,22,23,24]

Haridra is Katu (Pungent), Tikta (Bitter) in taste, Ruksha (Drying), Ushna (Heat), subsides Kapha-Pitta, and Vata Vikaras. Varnya (Improves complexion). It cures Twak Dosha (Skin diseases), Aruchi (Dystaste), Meha (Urinary disorders), Rakta (Blood disorders), Shotha (Edema), Pandu (Anemia), Vrina (Heals the wounds or ulcers), Kandugna (Cures itching sensation), Peenasa (Chronic rhinitis).

DARUHARIDRA- (**Berberis** aristata Roxb.ex DC, Berberidaceae)^[25,26,27,28,29,30,31] - Its properties are similar to *Haridra*, but specifically it cures *Netra-Karna-Asya Roganut* (eye, ear and oral cavity diseases), *Yakrid vikara*, *Rakta Vikara*.

VACHA- (*Acorus* calamus Linn, Araceae)^[32,33,34,35,36,37,38]

Vacha is Ugragandha (Sharp smell), Katu (Pungent), Tikta (Bitter), Ushna (Heat), Vanti Krit (Emetic), Vanhikrit (Appetizer). It cures Vibandha (Constipation), Adhmana (Abdominal distention), Shoola (Colic pain). It is Shakrad Shodhaka (Laxative), Mutra Vishodhaka (Diuretic). It alleviates Apasmara (Epilepsy), Kapha Dosha, Unmada (Insanity), Bhuta (Evila spirits), Jantu (Worms), Anila (Vata diseases). Vacha Choorna Bhasma with honey cures running nose, cough. Vacha Choorna is given with cow ghee improves memory, and voice and is applied on joints cures arthritis and paralysis, It cures urinary calculi, dysuria. Jwara (Fever), Atisara (Diarrhea), Ama (Undigested food material or toxins).

*ATIVISHA-(Aconitumheterophyllum*wall. ExRoyle, Ranunculaceae)^[39,40,41,42,43,4]

Ativisha is Ushna (Heat), Katu (Pungent), Tikta (Bitter) in taste, Pachani (Digestive), Dipani (Appetizer). It cures Kapha and Pittaja disorders, Atisara (Diarrhoea), Ama (Digests the undigested food material), Visha (Poisonous effects), Kasa (Cough), Vami (Vomiting), Krimi (Worms).

KATUKI - (Picrorrhiza kurroa Royle ex Benth, Scrophulariaceae) [45,46,47,48,49,50,51]

Katuka is Tikta (Bitter) in taste, Katu Vipaka (Pungent in post digestive effect), Ruksha (Drying), Hima (Cooling), Laghu (Light), Bhedini (Expels the hard stools0, Dipani (Appetizer), Hridya (Good for heart), Kapha-Pitta Nahaka, Cures Jwara (Fever), Prameha (Urinary disorders including diabetes), Shwasa (Dyspnoea), Kamala (Jaundice), Yakrid Roga (Liver diseases), Vibandha (Constipation), Kasa (Cough), Asr (Bleeding diseases), Daha (Burning sensation), Kustha (Skin diseases), Krimi (Worms).

CHITRAKA- (*Plumbago* zeylanica Linn, Plumbaginaceae)^[52,53,54,55,56,57,58]

Chitraka is Katu (Pungent in taste), Katu Vipaka (Pungent in post digestive effect), Dipana (Appetizer), Pachana (Digestive), Laghu (Light), Rooksha (Drying), Ushna (Heat). It cures Grahani (Sprue syndrome), Kustha (Skin diseases), Shotha (Edema), Arsha (Haemorrhoids), Krimi (Worms), Vata-Shleshma Hara (Alleviates Vata and Kapha), It is Grahi (Absorbent). Alleviates Vata-Pitta-Kapha. Chitraka Moola Panchanga Choorna is given with butter or milk cures all types of diseases, especially Kritrima Visha, Jalodara (Ascitis), Kustha (Skin diseases). Chitraka Mooola with Gomutra cures Arsha (Haemorrhoids).

CHIRABILVA- (Holoptelea integrifolia Planch, Ulmaceae)^[59,60]

Chirabilva is Laghu (Light), Ruksha (Dry), Tikta (Bitter), Kashaya (Astringent) in tastes, Katu Vipaka (Pungent at post digestive effect), Ushna Veerya (Hot in potency), It is Kapha-Pitta Shamaka (Subsides Kapha and Pitta Dosha), Shothagna (Edema), Dipana (Appetizer), Anulomana (Downward movement of Vata), Pitta Saraka (Laxative), Bhedana (Purgative), Krimigna (Anthelmintic), Raktashodhaka (Blood purifier), Pramehagna (Urinary diseases including diabetes), Kustha (Skin diseases), Medagna (Obesity).

Shweta Vacha properties are similar to Vacha. It is Ugragandha (Sharp smell), Katu (Pungent), Tikta (Bitter), Ushna (Heat), Vanti Krit (Emetic), Vanhikrit (Appetizer). It cures Vibandha (Constipation), Admana (Abdominal distention), Shoola (Colic pain). It is Shakrad Shodhaka (Laxative), Mutra Vishodhaka (Diuretic). It alleviates Apasmara (Epilepsy), Kapha Dosha, Unmada (Insanity), Bhuta (Evila spirits), Jantu (Worms), Anila (Vata diseases). Vacha Choorna Bhasma with honey cures running nose, cough. Vacha Choorna is given with cow ghee improves memory, and voice, and expels earth worms, urinary calculi, dysuria. Jwara (Fever), Atisara (Diarrhea), Ama (Undigested food material or toxins). It causes emesis. It s also called Prasika Vacha, Medhya. When applied on joints cures arthritis and paralysis.

CONCLUSION

By the above discussion all the drugs possessing *Katu* (Pungent), *Tikta* (Bitter), *Kashaya* (Astringent) in taste, *Ushna Virya* (Hot in potency), *Katu Vipaka* (Pungent at post digestive effect), *Laghu* (Light), *Ruksha* (Dry) properties. These properties helps to liquefy the accumulated *Doshas*, *Malas* and expel out of the body by *Sara Guna* (Laxative and Purgative action). These drugs also helps in the eliminating excess cellulite deposition from the body and helps to prevent further disease pathogenesis. These drugs helps in the clear out the obstruction or blocks by the above properties Therefore

might be used in the cardiac blocks, clots, haematoma, obesity etc metabolic diseases.
