PERCEPTION OF MEDICAL STUDENTS OF EITHER GENDER REGARDING MBBS AS A CAREER

ABSTRACT

This cross sectional interview-based study was performed among 208 MBBS Students who had enrolled for the MBBS course in Medical colleges across India. Among the medical students who participated in the study, males=52.41% and females= 47.6%. Age: 18 years=29.80%, 19 years=35.57%, 20 years=22.59%, 21 years=8.2%, 22 years=1%, 23 years=1.4%, 24 years=1.4%. First year participants= 76%, Second year =21.2%, Third year=1.4%, Final year= 0.5%, Intern=1%. As a Medical student on a scale, majority (25%) were 8 point score. Medical subjects interesting =89.4%. 28.8% students were curious about pathological or surgical or curative basis of medicine. Regarding the satisfaction of the concerned medical college and medical education, answer yes=75%.

INTRODUCTION


Medical Profession is the most essential and one amongst the top most profession in the modern society. To become a doctor is the most ambitious profession among most of the children.^[1] To enter into the medical field, MBBS (Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery), one has to clear a tough competitive entrance examination and thereafter the selection into the Medical College. But many of the students choose their career because of parental pressure and to fulfill their parents' wish. To become an eminent doctor, one has to work very hard during undergraduate and postgraduate level. One should have passion towards the profession. Medical practice is regarded as a noble profession since it provides an opportunity to serve the people in need. [2] This profession itself is demanding, it is desirable that highly motivated students join.

MATERIAL AND METHODS

This cross sectional study was conducted by administering a pre-tested and pre-validated questionnaire via Google forms to the participants. The study was conducted on the medical students who enrolled in medical colleges across India. The participants' age was 18 years and above, of either gender. Statistical Calculations were adapted to Microsoft Excel Spreadsheet.







In the present study, total number of participants were 208. Age of the participants was between 18 and 24 years. 18 years=29.80%, 19 years=35.57%, years=22.59%, 21 years=8.2%, 22 years=1%, years=1.4%, 24 years=1.4%. Male participants=52.4 %, Female participats-47.6%. First year participants= 76%, Second year =21.2%, Third year= 1.4%, Final year= 0.5 %, Intern=1%. The distribution of their residence, Urban=75.5%, semi-urban= 13.9%, Rural=10.6%. Their feeling as a medical student, majority responded with a score of 8(25%) and next score was 7(19.7%). Lowest was for score 2(1.4%). As per Kishore. Y. jothula and others^[3], Self interest was the major reason for choosing MBBS course. Zayapragassarazan Z and others [4] revealed in their study that it is essential for the teachers to be aware of their learners perception about choosing a career in medicine. N Asha Rani and others[5] described in their study that medical students were early deciders and passion was the major motivational factors. 55.8% participants opted for the first and the only career choice. JakubG^[6] revealed a significant decline in the level of interest in seeking employment abroad as observed with the progress of studies. In the present study, 89.4% revealed that they found medical subjects interesting. 21.6% are curious about working on human body,28.8% curious about pathological or surgical or curative basis of medicine, 12% reported that it is satisfactory when providing treatment. Dignity and respect reported by 15.4% of participants. Sonal P and others [7] reported that several students do not have a defined career plan. Charles B etal^[8] reported that the recognition of excellence in social accountability should be gauged in a given context at a given time for best use being made available opportunities and resources for health department. Present study's 16% reported that parental pressure is involved to choose medicine.R G etal^[9] and Muhammad A.S etal^[10] reported that as per their studies, many students reported that it was their parents' wish to join medical course. But the study of M B Mustafa and others^[11] showed the importance of parental support. Rajeev K etal^[12] revealed that career choices of medical students often develop during the course. Present study shows that 64.9% participants agreed that the economic stability and well-being is one of the driving factors for choosing this career. Simon W etal^[13] reported that students are thinking about their career choices as a doctor and it would be important in determining career choices. The study shows that 11.1% participants believed social basis of being doctors as dignified personalities. Peter A T and others [14] reported that cultural heritage can conflict with youths. Rajani I etal^[15] reported that Indian parents' one of the biggest sources of pride is when their children achieve academic success.

CONCLUSION

Self-interest or passion for the medical profession is the most common reason for choosing MBBSas a career. Few students felt regret for choosing medicine as the course. Most important motives for entering medicine are related to the context of the work as a physician.

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
