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ABTRACT

Arsha (Hemorrhoids) are the enlargement of blood vessels of anal canal. Hemorrhoids are the common problem now a days due faulty lifestyle follows. The symptoms of hemorrhoids are pain during defecation, swelling of anus, bleeding and burning pain during defecation, constipation, abdominal discomfort. In ayurved Hemorrhoids comes under the gudgat vyadhi. Arivat pranani kilani means pain like enemy is the nirukti of Arsha vyadhi. In present Case Study of 64 year male Patients having symptoms of Gudapradeshi Daha (Burning at anal region), Gudapradeshi vedana (Pain at anal region), Saraktmalpravrutti (Bleeding during defecation), Malavstambh (Constipation). Diagnosis done as an Arsha (Hemorrhoids) undergo the Ayurveda Shaman treatment with Sitz bath for 15 days. After 15 days Patients were much relieved. Present Case Study is to Aim to study the Hemorrhoids (Arsha) in Ayurveda perspective and observed the result with Ayurveda medicine.

INTRODUCTION

Arsha (Hemorrhoids) defines as 'Arivat pranan shrinoti ho nasti iti arsha'A Disease in which torture patients vital force (prana) like enemy's. Arsha is common problem now a days. It has been described from the beginning of medical history. Sushrut was first Acharya who described arsha in details. Apart from its causes, type, sign and symptoms. He had also described its many fold of treatment from which the importance and prevalence of these diseases in the past can be interfered. Arsha (Hemorrhoids) are divided into two categories i: e 1) Internal and 2) External piles. Internal hemorrhoids means it is within the anal canal and it is covered by mucus membrane. External hemorrhoids is situated outside the anal canal and it is covered by skin. When both conditions co-exist the condition called as interoexternal hemorrhoids.

CASE STUDY

A 64 year Male Patient came in OPD with the symptoms of Gudapradeshi vedna (Pain at anal region), Gudadaha (Burning at Anal region), and Saraktmalpravrutti (Bleeding during defecation) Difficult to seat Malavstambh (Constipation) Gudakandu (Itching at Anus).

History of Present Illness

Patient was apparently alright 6 month before. Around 20 days before he had hard stool. Gradually developed the symptoms of Gudadaha (Burning at Anal region), Gudapradeshi Vedana (Pain at anal region), Saraktmalpravrutti (Bleeding during defecation), Difficult to seat, Gudakandu (Itching).

DISCUSSION

Hemorrhoids are described as "Varicose Veins of the Anus and Rectum", It found in three main locations: left lateral, right anterior and right posterior portions. Hemorrhoids are progressively increasing in the society. It is manifested due disturbed lifestyle or daily routines, improper or irregular diet intake, prolonged sitting, faulty habits of defecation etc. which results in derangement of Jatharagni leading to vitiation of Tridosha, mainly Vata Dosha These vitiated Doshas get localized in Guda Vali and Pradhana Dhamani which further vitiates Twak, Mansa, and Meda Dhatus due to Annavaha shrotodushti leads to development of Arsha. In order to prevent the Arsha vyadhi and its further complication pathya-apathya strictly followed. In Ayurveda its treatment has been described in four types. Aushadhi chikitsa, Agnikarma, Kshar and lastly Surgery. This depend upon chronicity and type of Arsha which chikitsa has to be done. The chances of recurrence is also increasing due to faulty lifestyle follows. The mass awareness in the community about prevention of Arsha vyadhi is needed.

Action of medicine

1) Vaishwanar churna

Saindhava lavana (Rock salt), Yamani (Trachyspermum ammi), Ajamoda (Trachyspermum Roxburghianum), Nagara Ginger (Zingiber officinalis), Haritaki (Terminalia chebula). Vaishwanar Churna has Agni Vardhak as well as Vatanuloman Property.

2) Kanchanar guggulu

Kanchanar (Bauhinia variegata) bark, ginger, black pepper, long pepper, Haritaki, bibhitaki, amalaki (The combination of triphala), Varuna (Crataeva nurvala bark), cardamom, Cinnamon, and Guggulu resin in equal amounts. It has Vatahar property. Shot (Inflammation) and Gudapradeshi Daha (Burning pain at anal region) can be managed with Kanchanar Guggulu.

3) Jirakadyarishtam

Jiraka (shveta Jiraka) Cuminum cyminum Guda Jaggery, Dhataki Woodfordia fruticosa, Shunthi Zingiber Officinale, Jatiphala Myristica fragrans, Mustaka (Musta) Cyperus rotundus, Tvak Cinnamomum zeylanicum, Ela (Sukshmaila) Elettaria cardamomum, Patra (Tejapatra) Cinnamomum Tamala, Nagakesara Mesua ferrea, Yamanika (Yavani), Trachyspermum Ammi, Kakkola (Kankola) Piper cubeba, Devapushpa (Lavanga) Syzygium aromaticum Jirakadyarishtam is Deepan, Pachan in action. It is proper the Apan vayu. It has Carminative, Digestive Property.

CONCLUSION

From this Study It is clear that Arsha Cases Can be managed with Ayurveda treatment in Initial Stage. Change in lifestyle and healthy diet is very important in the management of Arsha (Hemorrhoids). This is a Single Case Study large Scale Case Study needed with this Ayurveda treatment.

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
