

Gas blast Marie joy

A PENSIONER who was blown into the back garden when a massive gas blast wrecked her home has moved back into the rebuilt house.

Marie Burns, 75, was in a coma for three months after suffering 52 per cent burns in the explosion two years ago.

Three other houses in the terrace at Salford, Greater Manchester, were also reduced to rubble.

But all have now been rebuilt, while another five were refurbished at a total cost of £700,000.

Marie said: "I lost everything but now I can put it all behind me."

Cliff pride for Dame

FORCES' Sweetheart Vera Lynn has paid tribute to charity chiefs after a stretch of the White Cliffs of Dover was bought for the nation.

A National Trust appeal raised £1.2million to buy the 0.8-mile chunk – uniting five miles of Kent coastline.

Dame Vera, 95 – who sang World War Two classic (There'll Be Bluebirds Over) The White Cliffs Of Dover in 1942 – told the Trust: "Congratulations on achieving your goal.

"I think it is imperative that this piece of famous land should be kept by the Trust."

Cover up on slopes

SKIERS who refuse to wear helmets on the slopes will have their insurance ripped up in a landmark policy change.

Essential Travel claims to be the first British insurer to invalidate policies for customers injured while not using head protection.

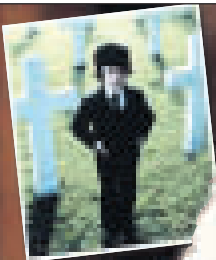
Their safety drive began in 2010 after actress Natasha Richardson, 45, died a year earlier skiing with no helmet in Canada.

Around 77 per cent of Brits now wear helmets, up from 62 per cent in 2010, the firm claim. A spokesman said: "Helmets seriously reduce the risk of potentially fatal injuries."

MY DEVIL BABY

Mum: He breathes fire and vanishes

A DISTRAUGHT mum says her baby is possessed by the devil and breathes fire.

Ana Feria Santos, 28, claims her two-month-old boy is the son of Satan after he scorched a mattress and clothes and keeps vanishing from his crib.

She claims her child is able to produce flames to burn the garments and furniture – while he can also transform into a spooky older boy with "intimidating eyes".

Sometimes she says she hears him cackling, only for him to stop as she approaches.

It has terrified Ana and the small community of Nueva Estrella, on Colombia's Caribbean coast – where

many people still believe in witchcraft. But the mum of five continues to care for her child, who she calls only "el niño" – the boy. Ana told The Sun: "This is Satanic. I have never in my life seen this."

Ana said her son regularly disappears from the family's wooden shack only to reappear in odd places – including a bowl, the fridge, the washing machine and even in a bag hanging on the wall.

She said: "The bag would break if it held 20 bananas so how come it didn't break when the baby was in it?" Ana pointed to a cupboard and said: "I saw him sitting on

that looking like a one-year-old boy. He had intimidating eyes."

Ana's tale is similar to classic 1976 horror movie *The Omen*, in which a child called Damien, above left, is possessed by the devil.

Red-faced El Niño scowled at our reporter during a crying fit – but no horns were visible.

Locals in the poor community have thrown stones at Ana's home and even demanded an exorcism.

But others claim she invented the bizarre tale. Ana has even been accused of child abuse although doctors have dismissed the claims.

Ana said: "I asked for help and people just laughed. I have asked my God to help me."
