

SCREENING

DID YOU KNOW?



Screening involves administering an assessment to all children (e.g., ASQ, DECA) to identify children's strengths and challenges to individualize care and education.

Developmental Screeners are formal questionnaires or checklists that ask about child's development including language, movement, thinking, behavior, and emotions.

Reviewing assessment results and developing intervention plans are often done in collaboration with families and health professionals.

How do you ensure staff is able of identify developmental concerns and administer an assessment?



REFLECT ON THIS...

Screen all children to identify any possible concerns early.

Communicate any developmental or behavioral concern with families immediately.

Remember screening results DO NOT indicate a diagnosis.

Encourage further evaluation if concerns persist (e.g., Early Steps, FDLRS).
