SPOTLIGHT: WAUPACA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

Caledonia does not employ a constable or have a police force to provide public protection and ordinance enforcement. The Town relies on the Waupaca County Sheriff's Office to provide these critical services, including everything from emergency response to accidents and fires, to enforcing town speed limits and road weight limits. At a recent Wisconsin Town's Association meeting, Sheriff Hardel from the Waupaca County Sheriff's Office explained the current staffing situation in the department. The Sheriff stated that Waupaca County ranks Number 68 in the state out of 72 counties in terms of the number of

deputies per 1,000 population. At any given time, there are as few as three deputies on patrol in the entire county. This is not good news for towns



like ours. The Sheriff's Office prioritizes on state and county needs first and municipalities like ours second. This is understandable, but it does create a real challenge in getting resources we need to ensure reasonable emergency response times and coverage for enforcing ordinances.

To help improve our town's police coverage, the Town Board passed a resolution this past spring directing our County Board Supervisor, Carl Kietzman, to work with the Sheriff's Office and the County Board to increase the number of deputies patrolling the county; and to do so by reallocating existing tax dollars, not increasing taxes. It is the expectation of the Town Board that more police resources are available to support our town's needs.

Town Board Meetings 3rd Monday of every month The summer construction season is winding down fast and most of our projects will be completed by the time you receive this newsletter. Our major road projects will be finished by mid-September including the complete reconstruction of Lietzke and Gorges Roads and continued paving work on Klemp Road. We are very pleased with the results on Lietzke and Gorges and both roads now have a substantial new road base and surface that should provide for long life. It has been a real challenge allocating money for maintaining the short dead-end roads in the town, like Gorges, and many of these roads are in poor condition as a result. A new low-cost technique was tried on Gorges Road and if it proves durable and long lasting, this approach will allow more of the short roads to be rebuilt in the future. This technique is called double chip seal coating and it is used widely by other towns but has not been used in Caledonia. If our results on Gorges Road are as good as other communities have experienced, we may finally have a cost-effective solution for rebuilding the many dead-end roads within the town.

Another very big project in the town was completed at the end of August – the Highway W reconstruction. This new road is a huge improvement over the previous highway and provides a much safer, easier to navigate roadway. The downtown Readfield section of the new highway provides for parallel parking, curb and gutter, and a widened roadway that significantly improves this area. While this was a challenging project and long time in coming, we want to thank the Waupaca County Board and the Waupaca County Highway Department for delivering such a great result.

The winter brush cutting projects have been selected and will be completed in January and February next year. The roads we will be working on are Magolski Road, sections of Guhl Road, and Popeyes Lane. All trees and brush within the road right-of-way will be removed.

NOXIOUS PLANT WARNING: WILD PARSNIP



Avoid Wild Parsnip! The fluids from Wild Parsnip can cause severe skin burns and irritation on people and animals when exposed to the sun. It is commonly found along unmaintained rural roadsides and pathways, but can grow anywhere weeds are found. While this plant is not found all over our township yet, it is spreading quickly. Heavy Wild Parsnip populations can be found along Hwy 45, Hwy W, and other town roads including Brehmer, Lietzke, and Gruetzmacher. The Town of Caledonia needs your help to prevent the spread of this noxious invasive species! Watch for notices on how to identify and manage this weed in our town.

PARK PLANNING UPDATE

With the wonderful addition of the outdoor restrooms in Caledonia Park, the CEC has wrapped up their first major project. Now the Park Implementation Team is hard at work identifying and prioritizing long-range park projects while researching grants and other funding options.

At this point, a perimeter walking trail is the top priority as the next project. Other options under consideration for inclusion in the park include a sledding hill, adult workout stations, expanded playground equipment, expanded parking, and improved storage. Possible Park Improvements:

Land Use Permits are required for any structure built or moved onto your property that will remain for more than 30 days. If you're going to be building a deck, patio, shed, etc make sure to contact Waupaca County Planning & Zoning at (715) 258-6255 prior to starting! More information can be found at www.co.waupaca.wi.us/departments/planning_and_zoning

Building Permits can be obtained by contacting Jim Emmons at (920) 779-6810. Be sure to get your building permit before a project is started. You will need the owner's name, property description, property tax ID, estimated project cost, and then you must pay the appropriate fee. Failure to obtain a permit prior to beginning work will result in double the permit cost.
