TOWN OF LEOLA, ADAMS COUNTY All Terrain Vehicle Ordinance No. 5-2006

An ordinance designating an all terrain vehicle route from the Rome town line at Aniwa Lane to Akron Drive at 3rd Avenue

Section I – Intent

The Board of Supervisors of the Town of Leola adopts the following all-terrain vehicle ordinance/route for the operation of all-terrain vehicles upon the roadway listed in Section III.

Following due consideration of the recreational value to connect trail opportunities and weighted against possible dangers, public health, liability aspects, terrain involved, traffic density and history of automobile traffic, this ordinance has been created.

Section II – Statutory Authority

This route is created pursuant to town authority under s. 23.33 (8)(b) and 23.33 (11) Wis. Stats.

The provisions of s. 23.33, Wis. Stats. are hereby adopted by reference.

Section III – Routes

1. The following roads are designated as a route:

Aniwa Lane at the Rome town line east to 6th Avenue; 6th Avenue south from Aniwa Lane to Apache Avenue; Apache Avenue east from 6th Avenue to 3rd Avenue; and 3rd Avenue north from Apache Avenue to Akron Drive. The route will cross Akron Drive and end at the right of way.

Said route is further described and identified by the attached map.

Section IV - Conditions

As condition for the use of this route, the following conditions shall apply to all operators (and passengers where applicable):

- 1. Travel is permitted <u>only</u> on the portion of the roadway, whether pavement, gravel, or dirt, which is maintained for vehicular traffic and not on the road right of way.
- 2. The speed limit is 45 miles per hour as posted.
- 3. Operation is restricted to daylight hours as defined as one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.
- 4. Operators must display an operating headlamp and tail lamp during all hours of operation

Section V – Enforcement

This ordinance shall be enforced by any law enforcement officer of the State of Wisconsin and/or Adams County Wisconsin.

Section VI – Penalties

Wisconsin state All-Terrain Vehicle penalties as found in s. 23.33(13)(a) Wis. Stats., are adopted by reference.

Section VII – Severability

The provision of this ordinance shall be deemed severable and it is expressly declared that the Town would have passed the other provisions of this ordinance irrespective of whether or not one or more provisions may be declared invalid. If any provision of this ordinance or the application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance and the application of such provisions to other person's circumstances shall not be deemed affected.

Section VIII – Sunset clause

This ordinance will sunset on July 31, 2007, unless acted upon by the Town Board at a duly noticed Board meeting.

Section IX – Special provisions

The Town Board reserves the right to rescind this ordinance at any time by a two-thirds vote of the Town Board in a duly noticed Board meeting.

Section X – Effective date

This ordinance becomes effective upon passage and publication and posting of applicable signs.
