

#### From City Hall March 2019

We wish Shawn best of luck and thank him for the great job he did in Holdingford. The City is working to find someone to fill the new Deputy Clerk—Treasurer Position. Melting snow has created trouble for businesses and home owners all around the city. City Maintenance Staff is working to move large snow piles to help divert some of the flooding. Water in basements and yards are especially frustrating. It won't get better for a while, I am sorry to say, until the melting snow and runoff is gone.

Sump pumps in your homes MUST pump water outside and not into city sewers. It seems we go from one mandate to another to tell you what you must do. Please understand that when the city issues these rules, it is for the good of the whole city. A sump pump that pumps water into the city sewer means we are spending money on chemicals to treat that water unnecessarily. Sump pump water must be pumped outside!

I do have some good news to share. The city has been awarded money for the Safe Routes to School Grant that we have been working on for the last few years. The money is ear marked for 2 sets of Solar Crossing Signal Lights, a sidewalk along County Road 17 connecting the Wobegon Park area and Holdingford Gas and Groceries' sidewalk. Also, there will be new tarring for the Pedestrian Pathway up to school. This work will be done this year. These upgrades will make Holdingford a bit safer for residents, old and young alike, to walk, bike and enjoy the outdoors in the community.

#### SNOW REMOVAL

Under Minnesota Statute, Section 169.42, depositing snow and ice within the public right-of-way and onto another property is deemed to be littering and punishable as a misdemeanor. In addition, Minnesota Statute, Section 160.2715 cites obstruction of the right-of-way or public roadway (with ice, snow) a misdemeanor. Please do not push snow across the roadways or deposit on public property.



The US Post Office would like to remind residents that it is their responsibility to keep the front of their mailboxes free of snow. They recommend clearing an area 10 feet before the box(es) and 10 feet beyond so that the mail carrier can drive in and out with their vehicle.

#### **SUMP PUMPS**

All sump pumps must be pumped outside! If they are being pumped down the drain inside your house, the water unnecessarily goes through treatment at the **Waste Water Treatment Plant** which means staff time, more wear and tear on the equipment and more chemicals to treat the water. Ultimately, higher costs to maintain the water and sewer system may mean higher taxes for you, our residents. When sumps are pumped outside, the water makes its way to the storm drains and into the river and/or groundwater where it is naturally recycled! Normal flow at the WWTP for treated water is about 50.000 gallons/day. Last Wednesday, with the rain, melting snow and sump pumps that were not pumped outside, there was over 150,000 gallons that went through our system, tripling our "normal" flow and increasing treatment costs!
