


City Compost Site

Do You Know Where the Water From Your Sump Goes?

The city sanitary system has been at maximum capacity during this rainy season due in large part to residents pumping their sump water into the city's sanitary sewer. This is causing extreme wear and tear on the equipment, extra expense in chemicals and risking overloading what the system can safely handle. If the city cannot get this under control, it could affect all residents in higher fees and possible expensive updates to the treatment plant, which would also hit residents' pocketbooks.

It is against city ordinance '51.080 to discharge water from your sump into the city sanitary sewer. As posted on the city website and the public marquee, water from your sump should be pumped outside not into the city sewer system. This is a misdemeanor and can be punishable by a sentence of not more than 90 days, or a fine of not more than \$1,000 or both.

The city council realizes not all residents may know where their sumps pump or drain to, and would like to offer the services of maintenance staff to come to your home to inspect free of charge how your sump is currently plumbed.
