

Accomplishments

- Water Treatment Plant Opened and Operational
- Road and Sidewalk Work
 - FY24 4.78 road miles and 1.63 sidewalk miles
 - FY25 4.75 road miles and 1.45 sidewalk miles
- School Repairs and Improvements (\$6.4M), Including Memorial and McGovern roofs,
 McGovern tile replacement, High School water heater replacement
- Fire Dept. Emergency Calls: 2,914 last year, a 220% increase over ten years;
 through State earmark, able to implement Pedal Medic program
- Council on Aging served 2,473 congregate meals, 3,424 with fitness/exercise programming, 937 in community education, and provided 1,175 rides
- Parks & Recreation ran 752 activities with 8,252 participants, and hosted special events including Summer Concerts, Fall Movies in the Park, and the Pumpkin Walk

- Medway's aggregation plan approved by Dept. of Public Utilities in late October
- Update on anticipated electricity pricing at December 2 Select Board Meeting
- Goal to roll out pricing, including green options, in late spring 2025
