- Replacing Original 2004 Inner Fencing
- Replacing Lighting Fixtures w/ Modern & Efficient Technology
- Installing Conduit For Future Scoreboard Enhancements

Synthetic Turf With "BrockFILL" Option

- Wood Particle Infill Material Alternative
- Can Be Cooler (Temp) Than Crumb Rubber
- Minimum Added Cost Of \$22,000 Other Bids As High As \$155K
- Product Is NOT Recommended Or Supported By M.H.S:
 - Surface Can Cause Increased Abrasions While Sliding
 - Surface Becomes Very Hard In Colder Temps Injury Risk
 - More Material Movement During Heavy Rain = Unsafe Areas and Greater Grooming/Maintenance
 - Decreased Traction Leads To Greater Risk Of Injury When Cutting or Changing Direction

Grass Field Option Considerations

- Wide & Wild Bid Ranges Raising Concerns
- Minimum Added Construction Cost Between \$68K and \$1.3
 Million PLUS \$100K In Irrigation Work
- Likely Increased Change Order Requests Due To Site Conditions
- Limited Use Of Grass Fields (Growing, Grooming, Weather, Etc.) – Estimated 60% Reduction In Use
- Reduction in Rental Revenue = Higher Taxpayer Costs For Field Maintenance
- Increase in Staffing Needs to Maintain Grass Fields
- Increase in Water Demand for Irrigation
- Field Would Not be Usable for Two Seasons

Projected Revenue Loss With Grass Fields

- Projected 60% Reduction In Use and Revenue Potential Per Field
- Hanlon Would Become A "Game Field" Only
 - No Rental Income Generated
 - Practices Moved To North & Lamson Fields Reducing Youth Sports Time
 - Outside Groups Not Looking For Tournament Use On Grass
 - Further Scheduling Limitations When Hanlon Is "Resting" Due To Wear & Tear
- •Loss of Tournament Revenue (All 3 Fields): \$112,318 (2024)
- •Loss of Non-Town Rental Use (All 3) (not including Scorpions): \$181,465 (2024)
- •Loss of Long-Term Rentals:
 - Largest non-Medway rental group: Scorpions \$110,838 (2024)
- •Total Outside Revenue At Risk (All 3 Fields): \$404,621
- •Potential Loss Of Revenue From Reduced Youth Sports Fees \$??????

Are Synthetic Crumb Rubber Fields Safe? EPA's Position Suggests "YES"

- PFAS Mitigation: Leading manufacturers do not use materials with intentionally added PFAS. Certification can be provided. Offering a safer alternative for players and the environment.
- Recycling Solutions: Used turf carpets can be recycled into other products like shock pads or plastic lumber, reducing waste and environmental impact.
- **EPA Research Findings**: Studies by the EPA show that while chemicals are present in crumb rubber, exposure levels are minimal. (Source URL: <u>EPA Research on Recycled Tire Crumb</u>)


