Resolution Ending Moratorium on Large Livestock Facilities

The Town Board of the Town of Sterling, Polk County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

WHEREAS on September 16, 2019, the Town of Sterling adopted Ordinance No 19-0916-Moratorium on Livestock Facilities Licensing. Adopted Ordinance Exhibit A

WHEREAS the purpose of ordinance 19-1916 was to provide the Town of Sterling time to study, review, consider and determine whether the creation of a Livestock Facilities Licensing Ordinance or other ordinances would be required to protect the environment, water quality, public heath or safety and property in the Town of Sterling.

WHEREAS the Town of Sterling created the Large-Scale Livestock Study Committee. During the moratorium, the committee was tasked with the responsibility to research, analyze and synthesize scientific literature regarding the potential impacts of large-scale livestock facilities.

WHEREAS the Town Board of Sterling adopted Resolution 122121- Resolution Extending Moratorium on Livestock Facilities at a regularly scheduled and properly posted board meeting on 12/22/2021. Resolution 122121 extended the moratorium for one year from its effective date OF 12/22/2021. Exhibit B

WHEREAS the Large-Scale Livestock committee has concluded its research and submitted to the Town Board their final Committee Report.

Now, therefore at a regularly scheduled and properly posted meeting on June 20, 202, the Town of Sterling board voted to end the large-livestock moratorium. Motion passed with a roll call vote of 2-aye and 1 abstain.

Be it further resolved that, the passing of this resolution, the moratorium on large-scale livestock facilities is ended.

The town clerk shall properly post or publish this resolution as required by law under sec. 60.80 pf Wis. Stats. Resolution takes effect the day after posting.
