Narrative

The Blind Swine Smokehouse — This establishment, located at 28 Broadway, will be a restaurant with a bar. The hours of operation to the public will be five days a week, 3pm to 10pm. For this project to come to fruition, this site will have to go through a construction process to create an up-to-date kitchen and restaurant which passes the health department and Saranac Lake building codes and requirements. This location includes two points of entrance/exit. At this establishment, there will be handicap/unisex bathrooms for customers only. There will be a seating capacity of sixty seats or less inside.

The style of food that will be served will be smoked meats. These smoked meats include pork, beef, poultry, and possibly seafood. The meals served will come with a variety of different side dishes to accompany the meats. There will be a variety of non-alcoholic and alcoholic drink options available from the bar within.




