Trails

1.31 miles of new trails were constructed in 2016-2017



Bikeways

DOT added 0.7 miles of shared lane markings to the bicycle network on Bloomingdale Ave & Broadway. Saranac Lake now has 2.9 total miles of bike ways.



Sidewalks

480 linear feet of sidewalk were replaced by DPW

Wayfinding Signage

Wayfinding maps were installed around Saranac Lake, including at the Riverwalk entrance, Berkeley Green, Riverside Park, and the downtown Parking lot. The signs have two sides with maps of streets, and points of interest. They have been supported by numerous businesses, organizations, and individual sponsors. Directional wayfinding signs have also been installed at various intersections throughout the village. More signs will be installed in 2018. PTAB is still seeking sponsors for additional signs.

PTAB PROJECTS

Parks Vision Plan

The Village of Saranac Lake was awarded \$30,000 in LWRP funding to create a Parks Vision Plan for eleven village parks. In 2016, PTAB held public input meetings at each park and collected surveys. The parks in the plan include:

Ampersand Park
Baldwin Park
Berkeley Green
Mt. Pisgah
Prescott & Riverfront Parks
Riverside Park
Riverwalk
SkatePark
Ward Plumador Park
William Morris Park/Carousel
William Wallace Park/Lake Colby Beach



PTAB analyzed all of the public input collected and identified priority projects for each park. The Village hired The Chazen Companies to create conceptual designs and renderings for each park vision.

Complete Streets Policy & Checklist

PTAB worked with the Department of Public Works and Village Manager to draft a Complete Streets Policy which was adopted by the Village Board of Trustees. A Complete Streets Checklist was also created. The checklist is used during the planning phase of all infrastructure projects to ensure that the needs of bicyclists and pedestrians are considered. To date, 6 road projects have been reviewed using the checklist.



COMMUNITY PROJECTS



43 acres were added to Dewey Mountain Recreation Center which will be used to expand the trail network. 1.31 miles of new trails were added to Dewey Mountain in 2017.

Saranac Lake SkatePark Completed

The volunteer Skate Park Committee completed the Skate Park in 2016. Skateboarders use the park, even in the "snowless" winter months. Skateboard use was greater than 30 users a day, with 5 to 20 users at any given time during the spring, summer and fall months. Two Skateboard competitions were held in 2016. The Village of Saranac Lake hosted skate clinics, where experienced skaters volunteered their time to coach younger skaters. Three experienced skateboarders (Ben Karkowski, Evan Davis, and Nick Orten) gave 32 skate board clinics to our local boys and girls this summer. Ives McCarty was instrumental in advertising and getting the park ready for these lessons. Key Donors are recognized with a boulder and bronze plaque. The wild flower garden was expanded, providing a welcome place in the center of Saranac Lake.

Safe Routes To School (SR2S)



- •Saranac Lake Police Department in partnership with Traffic Safety provided education to 50 kids at the Saranac Lake Summer Youth Program.
- •Kiwanis Club gave out 65 helmets at the June Bike Rodeo. 90 kids attended.
- •Walker the SR2S chicken walked to school with 50 students during 2 events in Saranac Lake.
- •Signs with distances to the schools were posted in neighborhoods throughout Saranac Lake.
- •Stencils of the SR2S logo were painted on sidewalks along routes to school by students.

Results:

There has been a study to show an increase in the number of kids that walk to school during special events with Walker in Saranac Lake from 2015-2017. Percentage of students walking/biking to or from school remained steady around 6%-8% at Petrova.

The fun runs take place every Thursday evening at Riverside park during the summer months.




An average of 79 racers compete each week and many more people are drawn to the park as spectators.

GRANT AWARDS

- •Adirondack Park Smart Growth Implementation grant award of \$75,000 to construct the Saranac Lake southern gateway multi-use trail. The trail will connect the proposed Rail Trail to Lake Flower Avenue businesses.
- •Eastern Adirondack Health Care Network's Built Environment Program awarded \$5,600 to the Village of Saranac Lake for the purchase of the bank-out no-right-on-red signs at the intersection of Main and River Streets.
