Whereas, the health and safety of the people of Saranac Lake is our primary concern; and

Whereas, residents of Park Ave on May 1, 2023, requested additional Stop Signs be installed at the intersection of Park and Catherine; and

Whereas, this request was discussed at the June 12, 2023, board meeting with general agreement that this would be appropriate; and

Whereas, this request was discussed at multiple subsequent board meetings with general agreement that this would be appropriate; and

Whereas, this request has been discussed for six months with no action;

Therefore, Be it resolved, the Board of Trustees hereby requests that the Village Manager has the village DPW department order and install stop signs on Park Ave at the intersection with Catherine St and take appropriate actions to add additional measures to alert drivers of the new traffic control feature. To the Members of the Village Board:

We residents of the Park Avenue Neighborhood of the Village of Saranac Lake are writing to request that the intersection of Park Avenue and Catherine Street be made into a four-way stop by adding two new stop signs that stop traffic on Park Ave at the intersection.

We make this request in the interest of public safety and we believe that two new stop signs will be an effective and inexpensive way to reduce traffic speed. As you know, over the past decade numerous families with young children have moved to the neighborhood and the streets are often filled with children on bicycles. Additionally, the visibility for drivers at the intersection of Park Ave and Catherine Street is limited in the summer by vegetation and in the winter by snowbanks, increasing the risk of collision. There has been at least one vehicle collision at the intersection in the last few years.

Park Avenue is a wide and straight street with a design that inadvertently promotes higher driving speeds. Since the Village annexed that part of Park Ave through the former American Management Association, it has become an alternative route for leaving town. The placement of new stop signs at Grove Street and Park Avenue in 2020 made significant improvements to slowing traffic in that part of the neighborhood. We greatly appreciate the Village's efforts to control traffic speeds on Park Ave and Grove Street and ask that you expand this good work to Park Ave and Catherine Street.
