RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO HIRE  
TRISTIN FITZGERALD TO THE POSITION OF WATER AND WASTE WATER MAINTENANCE WORKER  
WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS (DPW)

WHEREAS, the Village currently has an open position of a Water and Waste Water Maintenance Worker and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Saranac Lake is committed to maintaining a full staff and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Saranac Lake submitted Tristin Fitzgerald's application to Franklin County Civil Service and it was approved and,

WHEREAS, Dustin Martin is recommending Tristin Fitzgerald for the position of Water and Waste Water Maintenance Worker and,

WHEREAS, this position is a member of the Teamsters Union and will begin with all the benefits of a starting union member and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, authorization is given to the Village Manager to hire Tristin Fitzgerald as a Water and Waste Water Maintenance Worker.

## Pertinent Existing Snowmobile Laws

### State Law:

No person shall operate a snowmobile within one hundred feet of a dwelling between twelve o'clock midnight and six o'clock a.m., at a speed greater than minimum required to maintain forward movement of the snowmobile.

### Village Law:

No person shall operate a snowmobile on any of the streets or roadways between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m., Eastern Standard Time, except on Fridays and Saturdays. The prohibited hours shall be from 12:00 midnight to 7:00 a.m. on Fridays and Saturdays.

No person shall operate a snowmobile on any sidewalk or right-of-way reserved only for pedestrian traffic, except to cross the same at approximate right angles to reach property upon which operation of snowmobiles is lawful. Every operator of a snowmobile shall obey all traffic signs and signals within the Village.

All streets and roadways of the Village of Saranac Lake are open to the use except:

- A. Main Street from River St to Church Street.
- B. Church Street.
- C. Broadway from Main Street to Ampersand Avenue.
- D. Bloomingdale Avenue from Broadway to Church Street.
- E. St. Bernard Street.
- F. Academy Street.
- G. Woodruff Street from Broadway to Church Street.

Village speed limit is 30 mph

## Clean up Guidelines for Fireworks Permit Requesters

Fireworks shows cause pollution in the form of debris. Clean up of the fireworks debris that results from your event is mandatory, and is the permit requester's responsibility, to prevent polluting the land and/or water.

The following guidelines are designed to assist you with understanding expectations for clean up after your event, they are not designed to encompass safety guidelines. First and foremost, you must follow all safety regulations specified in the Village's permit and your fireworks vendor's contract, if applicable.

1. Whenever possible, choose the most environmentally friendly fireworks materials available from your fireworks vendor. Fireworks debris consists of a mixture of biodegradable and non-biodegradable materials. **Submit a letter from the fireworks company stating that the product being used is the most environmentally friendly product available.** You are required to clean up all debris, regardless of what type it is.
2. Launch fireworks from an area that you will be able to easily access to clean up debris effectively. All fireworks must be launched from land at least 20 feet from the shoreline. Please note, the shoreline setback recommendation relates to water pollution reduction measures only, not safety setbacks. First, you must follow all safety setbacks relating to people, overhead obstructions and property, from the Village's permit and your fireworks vendor's contract, if applicable. After that, if the shoreline setback is possible within that distance, it is recommended.
3. A deposit is required to ensure the site is cleaned up after the show. No later than the day after your fireworks show, **clean the area surrounding the fireworks launch site** and ensure that all pieces of debris are removed. You might consider providing the following items for your clean-up effort:
  - Leaf rake (metal garden/rock rakes don't work as well)
  - Leaf bags
  - Snow shovel (the wider, the better)
  - Work-type gloves

Village staff will perform an inspection of the site in the days following your event. If the site is clean then your deposit will be refunded. If the site is not clean then the village will retain the deposit. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping the Village of Saranac Lake clean.
