RESOLUTION APPROVING A PROPOSAL FOR PUBLIC ART

WHEREAS, the Village of Saranac Lake Board of Trustees recognizes the importance and impact of downtown, parks and recreation, and arts and culture in driving economic development and contributing to the quality of life in the community; and

WHEREAS, the 2022-2023 Village Budget includes \$10,000 for a Community Enhancement Project; and

"WHEREAS, the Community Enhancement Project chosen by the three Advisory Boards must be tied directly to 1 or more of the following adopted plans: Downtown Saranac Lake Strategic Investment Plan (2019), Arts and Culture Master Plan (2018), and Park Vision Plan (2018); and,"

WHEREAS, the Village of Saranac Lake Board of Trustees approved the use of Community Enhancement Program funds for a public art project proposed by the three Advisory Boards; and

WHEREAS, the Village issued a Request for Proposals for public art installations at Riverfront and Prescott Parks; and

WHEREAS, the Village received 36 proposals from artists; and

WHEREAS, members from each of the three Village Advisory Boards have reviewed the proposals and recommend that the \$10,000 be awarded to Matthew Horner for installation of public art at Prescott or Riverfront Park;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Saranac Lake Board of Trustees hereby accepts the recommendation of the review committee and authorizes the Village Manager to execute a contract with Matthew Horner.

Statement of Interest


For the Saranac Lake Proposal my vision is to create three large stone portals using the three Saranac Lakes as a reference point for their forms. I would source three glant stones and carve the centers out to create holes/cut-outs or voids that will be an abstract representation of the lakes, and loosely mimicking their topography the largest stone portal would represent Upper Saranac Lake, the next would be Lower Saranac Lake and finally the smallest is Middle Saranac Lake.


My process begins when I choose the stone that I will source from my property in Jay or at a nearby stone quarry. Most of the rock is igneous (Granitic) and metamorphic (Gneiss). The high peaks of the Adirondacks are composed mainly of Anorthosite, an ancient stone estimated at 1.1 billion years old, created by continental collision. It is one of my favorites to carve, and I use it in many of my pieces.

Once the carving process is complete, I would arrange the stones in a way that mimics the relationship and orientation of the lakes to one another. Visitors would be invited to interact with them, whether it's touching, walking around or even through them. I would invite physical contact, to explore the voids within the stones.


I am extremely excited about the proposed installation site since I have a personal history with it. When I moved to the Adirondacks full-time in 1994, I settled in Saranac Lake and lived on Lake Flower Avenue with a view of the intended sites from my bedroom window. I made a strong connection to the community here—I was welcomed by it and formed strong bonds with people here. Having my installation at the shoreline of Lake Flower would be like coming full circle.


I am currently in the process of transforming a 10.69-acre space in Jay that I purchased in fall of 2022 that I plan to transform into my new art studio and an outdoor sculpture park. Having my work have such high visibility at Saranac Lake would help to allow me to realize my vision.





Concept Map, Inspiration for Saranac Lake installation project








