DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

- Put a fresh coat of paint on the bridge that goes over the Saranac River, known as the Broadway Bridge
- Leaf sweeping

WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

- Wastewater: took the UV system off-line for the winter

- Water: Running well #1, 3 days a week and monitoring water quality

- In the process of setting a new 2024 grant work schedule
- Restore NY Grant initial meeting with Pendragon Theatre Managing Director and members of the Board of Directors for thoughts on their awarded project to rehab the downtown building, 56 Woodruff Street
 - Creating a project timeline
- After a 28 week session, the construction for the Downtown Revitalization
 Initiative public projects is wrapping up
 - Berkeley Green improvements, William Morris Park, street trees, new intersection bump out for the Urban Forestry Project, and Woodruff Street (East) streetscape
