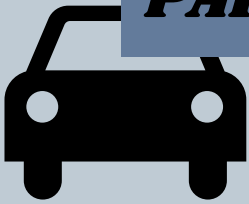

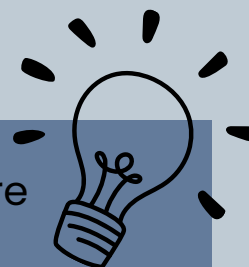


UTILITIES & TAXES

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

- **Wastewater:** Getting the plant ready for winter
- **Wastewater:** FPI & Weydman was on site for punch list items
- **Wastewater:** New garage doors installed
- **Water:** Continuing putting well #1 into distribution 3 days a week for one cycle and doing testing
- **Water/Wastewater:** Have been meeting with KSP & AES on future and current projects



PARKS AND RECREATION

- Snow making pipe was delivered November 20th to Mt. Pisgah
- Playground equipment installed at Ken Garwood POW Memorial park, installation of landscape cloth and geotextile fabric

November Committee Highlight

Housing Task Force

The Housing Task Force (HTF) members have been working closely with Village of Saranac Lake's Code Enforcement Officer Chris McClatchie on a substantial list of vacant/derelict properties in the Village.

The numbers that reflect this effort:

- 33 Properties have been improved through code enforcement intervention.
 - 26 of these properties have been issued building permits, while the remaining seven are waiting on stamped plans/contractor availability/owner logistics
- 16 vacant properties are currently identified and verified (down from 19 a few months back). 4 of these vacant properties are bank owned and awaiting foreclosure proceedings.
- 13 new certificates of occupancy have been issued.
