

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

- Sewer and storm work have been completed on Main Street
- Main, Pine, Petrova, and Winona have all been paved
- Concrete work on Main and Winona will be completed later this summer
- Repaired water leak on Kiwassa

- Street painting the week of the 8th, weather dependent
- Begin installing the Geo Mat at the park the week of the 8th weather dependent
- Hoping to be able to install manifolds for the athletic fields during the month of July

WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

- Wastewater: Repairing or replacing various equipment around the plant
- Water: Water sampling on McKenzie Pond for possible use as second water source
- Water/Wastewater: Routine Maintenance
- Wastewater: Working with contractors and AES to finish up punch list items and close out UV project
- Water: Working with SDA on water comprehensive report and submitted to funding agencies
- **Wastewater:** Working with AES on Plant and collection system comprehensive report and submitted to funding agencies

PARKS AND RECREATION

- Majority of the flower planters have been put out
- Monday the 1st, the parks employees put out the rest of the flower planters
- Routine mowing is continuing

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- AEDC Revolving Loan Fund has been approved and funding will be available for up and coming small businesses
- Downtown Flower Planters have been delivered to the local businesses on Main
 Street and looking beautiful as ever, thanks to the Hot House!

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Officer Beebe attended Field Training Officer School in Plattsburgh, NY to become a certified Field Training Officer for new recruits
- Chief Perrotte, Officer Siddell, Officer Fleury, and Sgt. Cromp attended Desert Snow
 Criminal Interdiction School in Morrisonville for 3 days. This course focuses on investigation of illegal narcotics
- Officer Siddell worked a detail at the US/Canada Port of Entry with US Customs.
 These types of details are excellent training and important to the safety of our community as we work in conjunction with our Federal counterparts to stop the entry of illegal drugs, guns, and other contraband into the Tri Lakes
- SLPD participated in a fun community engagement with Keith and Marge Murphy of Lake Flower Ave with the Lake Flower Goats
- Saranac Lake Police Department was featured in the NYS Dept. of Criminal Justice Services Knowledge Bank where information is shared between Police Agencies about initiatives so that other Agencies can adopt programs that are working well.
 The SLPD CALEP (Counselor and Law Enforcement Partnership) was featured
- SLPD began a community policing initiative, Positive Tickets. This initiative gives the Officers the ability to, "issue," a ticket to individuals in the community who are seen making a positive different. The initiative is primarily focused on youth in the community. It partners with Teddy's Ice Cream stand in Bloomingdale, owned by former SLPD Sgt. John Gay and his family. Recipients of a ticket will be entitled to a free ice cream cone. We have other businesses already interested in providing the next batch of prizes

POLICE DEPARTMENT CONTINUED

- Sgt. Brown and Officer Siddell attended an Animal Cruelty training at the New York
 State Police Academy in Albany. This training is crucial to investigate reports of animal neglect, maltreatment, and cruelty
- Officers assisted in hosting the Kiwanis's Bike Rodeo at the Saranac Lake Civic Center. This is always a popular event that is well attended by the Community. Sgt. Cromp, Officer Conners, and Julia Coffman attended and helped set up obstacle courses for the kids. They also handed out goodies, to include lights to clip on their bicycles
- Chief Perrotte attended the NYS Regional Domestic Violence meeting in Plattsburgh which brought Community partners and service providers together to discuss how to ensure a trauma informed and Victim centered response to Domestic Violence
- SLPD hired a new Officer, Gabriel Faubert. Gabe is a Saranac Lake High School & SUNY Potsdam Graduate
- Chief Perrotte presented at the Saranac Lake Adult Center about common scams in alignment with World Elder Abuse Day
- Chief Perrotte presented about safety measures for Home Health Aides at North Country Home Services
- Officer Beebe, Officer Bates, Sgt. Cromp, Officer Faubert, and Chief Perrotte attended the Saranac Lake Surge Baseball game against the Malone Border Hounds at Petrova Field. Chief Perrotte threw out the first pitch
