FOOD TRUCK OPERATORS

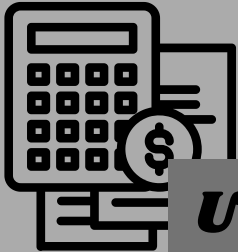

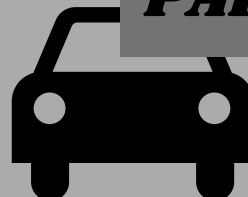


UTILITIES & TAXES

DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS

- Sewer lines are completed on Main St, other work has begun on May 29th
- Sweeping is ongoing throughout the Village
- Street painting will begin when sweeping is complete
- Docks were put in at the beach on May 28th



WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

- **Wastewater:** Repairing or replacing various equipment around the plant
- **Water:** Water sampling on McKenzie Pond for possible use as second water source
- **Water/Wastewater:** Routine Maintenance
- **Wastewater:** Working with contractors and AES to finish up punch list items and close out UV project
- **Water:** Working with SDA on water upgrades for June deadline
- **Wastewater:** Working with AES on Plant upgrade information for June deadline



PARKS AND RECREATION

- Mowing of Village Parks
- Started installing the new road signs for Pisgah
- Reseeding is happening in excavated areas on the side of the ski slope at Mt Pisgah



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

- Development Board completed the approval of all STR Special Use Permits
- The department welcomed Bayle Reichert as the Administrative Assistant to take on a lot of the community organizations such as Music on the Green

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Hosted the Law Enforcement Bicycle Patrol Course with 18 Officers from around NYS
- Several of our Police Officers attended Evidence Collection Training
- A few of our Police Officers attended Narcotics Search Warrant Training
- Awards were given to Sgt. Cromp and Officer Beebe from the Franklin County Traffic Safety, Sgt. Cromp was given the STOP DWI award and Officer Beebe was given the Traffic Safety Award
- Officers attended St. Bernard's Parent's Night, Bloomingdale Elementary Safety Day speaking upon bicycle safety
- Chief Perrotte participated in the North Country Honor Flight transporting two Vietnam Veterans
- Officers has been assisting Bike Adirondacks with the Bike Bus that is a group of students riding their bicycles to school
- Carter Kits Sensory Bags were deployed in each Police Vehicle these kits contain hearing protection and sunglasses, a weighted blanket, and multiple sensory items to help de-escalate an individual on the Autism Spectrum during an emergency response
- SLPD was awarded \$241,500 in funds from the NYS DCJS Law Enforcement Tech Grant the funds will be utilized to upgrade existing Police technology and purchase new items

June Highlight

The Village of Saranac Lake Police Department

held a NYS Law Enforcement Bicycle Patrol Course that consisted of riding in low light conditions, pushing the bicycle and rider to the limits and beyond, care and maintenance of the bicycles, and the final day included a range day where they put together all of the skills they learned throughout the week on top of the skills they already possess as trained Police Officers. 18 Police Officers from around NYS attended with the main course taking place at the Saranac Lake Civic Center but the course utilized a lot of the Rail Trail.
