- Chief Perrotte conducted in service training for the Clinton County Sheriff's Office on Officer Wellness. This training is crucial to ensure that the Community receives the best of its Officers. As they say, an empty well gives no water. If our Officers are stressed, it plays out in our response to the Community Members who need us.
- Chief Perrotte has also started a monthly Officer Wellness initiative which serves all Agencies in the Region. Members come together to discuss current topics in Policing, calls which Agencies have responded to which contribute to stress faced by Officers, and other pertinent topics.

SLPD in the Media:

-Chief Perrotte in conjunction with 106.3 NBZ-FM has initiated 2 Public Safety Broadcasts on that Station. One of which is to follow along with the 9pm routine, reminding folks to lock their doors. The second is a Holiday safety tips reminder for holiday shopping, etc. A 3rd ad was done promoting the Santa's Jukebox campaign which collects donations to provide to Holiday Helpers of Saranac Lake

-Chief Perrotte also conducted an interview with WPTZ regarding, "Porch Pirates." This public safety broadcast gave tips on how to avoid having packages stolen this Holiday Season.

• Officer Beebe participated with the Saranac Lake High School Driver's Ed Class in one of their daily drives. Having an Officer present with the students helps build upon the existing rapport that we have and enhances that positive relationship between Police and the students.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- Officer Beebe has been in the schools instructing the LEAD (Law Enforcement Against Drugs & Violence) curriculum. This program was brought back to replace the DARE Program which stopped during COVID. Opioid funding which SLPD received was used to fund training for Officer Beebe and Sgt. Brown to instruct this curriculum as well as to purchase needed materials. This is another great program to help build our relationship with the students and staff at Saranac Lake School District.
- Work is starting to begin outfitting the Armory building for the move of SLPD to its new home. We will be posting a sign in the coming week or so to alert residents and visitors alike that this will be our new home. We have also ordered a new permanent sign which is in the manufacturing process from a local vendor who did the Saranac Lake Village signs. Officers, Vendors, and staff will be working at the building throughout the coming weeks in hopes of a January 1 soft move in. There will likely be some overlap for about a month or so before all is settled in. The Officers and Staff of SLPD are grateful to the Village Board, Mayor, Village Manager, and Staff for the opportunity this building presents to not only Saranac Lake PD but Law Enforcement regionally, with training opportunities, etc.
