Administrative:

-Chief Perrotte attended training to become certified as an FBI Resilience Instructor to build upon existing Officer Wellness strategies the Department is using. Chief Perrotte instructs Officer Wellness in Police Academies as well as for other Agencies in the Region.

-Chief Perrotte attended the NYS DCJS Public Safety Symposium in Albany which brings together law enforcement leaders from around the State to discuss current events and issues facing law enforcement.

-Chief Perrotte, Officer Beebe, Officer O'Connell, and Sgt. Crompt attended the Blue Mass which was held right here in Saranac Lake at St. Bernard's Church. Sgt. Crompt and Officer Beebe participated in the Honor Guard and Chief Perrotte did a reading at the Service.

-Officer Beebe interacted with the Saranac Lake High School Driver's Ed class to answer questions and get acquainted with students for the new year.

-Officer Beebe and Officer Faubert took part in the annual Touch A Truck event at Saranac Lake Civic Center displaying a patrol car and our e-bikes and interacting with members of the community.

-The Saranac Lake Police Department hosted a back to school safety event at the Station where members performed child safety seat checks. Members of the Essex County Sheriff's Office also participated and did Child Safe IDs. Julia, Officer Beebe, and Officer Faubert were present.

-Chief Perrotte attended the Special Olympics Law Enforcement Torch Run in Plattsburgh and participated in the ceremony.

-Saranac Lake Police Department hosted the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation's Peer Support classes for individuals and groups. This class instructs attendees in peer support for fellow

responders and in the practice of conducting critical incident stress debriefings. The Saranac Lake Police Department has taken the lead in establishing a regional peer support team for first responders as a leader in Officer Wellness.
