The Baldwin Township Board is pleased to announce that the Minnesota Office of Administration Hearings issued a decision this morning authorizing Baldwin Township to incorporate as the City of Baldwin. The 20+ years of carefully creating the policies, ordinances and governmental structure necessary to bring forth the City of Baldwin, have come to fruition with the issuance of Judge Jessica Palmer-Denig's order incorporating Baldwin Township.

The Township would like to thank the residents of Baldwin Township for providing the Town Board the resources, support, commitment and faith necessary to pursue incorporation, without which this day would never have been possible. The Township would also like to thank Judge Jessica Palmer-Denig for a well-reasoned and well-resourced decision, and for so skillfully presiding over an emotional and energetic public hearing at which approximately 700 Township residents were in attendance to voice their concerns for the future of their community.

The Baldwin Town Board looks forward to the residents of Baldwin Township governing themselves as the City of Baldwin in the same tradition of self-reliance, public participation and responsive local government that has been the hallmark of Baldwin Township for so many decades.

There will be many great activities to participate in the FUN to share with family and friends. This will be a FUNFEST the whole family can enjoy. The younger members may want to play on the new Young Park playground equipment or enjoy the bouncy house. Family members can also enjoy a host of other activities, including the antique car show. Prizes will be awarded! The cost is only \$5 to register your antique car, so get your spot now by contacting Baldwin Town Hall at 763-389-8931. If you do not get the opportunity to see all the cars during the event, the cars will be moving over to Sunken Ship Brewery after the festival.

Speaking of friends, a fun activity will be a Dog Costume Parade. If you and your furry friend would like to participate, you can call Town Hall to get your name on the list or just come to FunFest with your furry buddy dressed in its best parade outfit. It is free to participate and there will be prizes.

To add to the day's enjoyment, there will be music in the park, thanks to our DJ, Mr. Cooper! Bring your own chairs for ample seating. Our Baldwin Fire Department will be cooking their delicious hamburgers and hot dogs, and you will also be able to find a bucket of popcorn or a swirl of cotton candy. You can also check out the craft and vendor fair for some shopping fun or join in a great game of BINGO, if you are feeling lucky!

In addition to the FunFest event, there are other recreational opportunities available for enjoyment. Take a look at our current parks and public accesses below.

Young Park—located at County Roads 19 and 38

- Walking Trails: The trail system consists of almost two miles of trails and boardwalks that wind through the park's wooded area, making it a wonderful walk-through nature while getting those steps in!
- Playground: New playground equipment was just put in this year! Along with the new playground equipment, impact access mats were put in to help accommodate wheelchair accessibility to the swings.
- Pavilion: The Pavilion accommodates approximately 30-75 people and has electric outlets. The Pavilion can be reserved by filling out the Parks Facilities Reservation Form and paying the required fees. The fee is \$125 for an all-day rental or \$75 for up to 4 hours. This is in addition to a \$100 cleaning deposit, which will be refunded if the facilities are left clean and with no damage. A reservation form and Park rules can be downloaded from Baldwin's website or you may contact Baldwin Town Hall.
- Ballfield: The ballfields are often busy with various tournaments and school usage, so the ballfield is not always available to rent, but a call can be made to Baldwin Town Hall to see about the cost and availability.
- The park is open from sun up to sun down and does provide a porta-potty onsite.
- Porta-Potty (April-October)

Sandy Lake—located at the southeast corner of Baldwin at 100th St NW and 99 1/2 St NW—284th Ave NW—287th Ave NW

- Swimming Beach— 284th Ave & 100th St.
- Boat Launch— Concrete and dock with fishing access on dock— 99 1/2 St & 287th Ave
- There is limited parking at Sandy Lake Beach
- Porta-Potty (April-October) at the swimming beach

Goose Lake Park—located at the northwest corner of the County Road 87 (285th Ave & 134th St)

- Walking Trails—approximately .32 miles of trails with plans to complete an additional walking trail
- Carry-in kayaking and canoe access
- 2 Benches
- 1 Picnic Table

Lake Helene— located at 279th Ave west of Lake Diane Rd.

- Boat Launch—dirt
- Carry-in Kayaking and canoe access

Elk Lake—285th Ave & 143rd St

- Boat Launch and Dock
- Picnic Table

Elk Lake—287th Ave

- Carry-in kayaking & canoe

The Park Committee plays an advisory role to the Town Board. They are responsible for making recommendations to the Town Board regarding managing, maintaining, and developing recreational areas.
