Brush Pick-Up Policy

Brush pile pick-up will be done during the last week of each month, April through October. Place your brush by the curb the Sunday before brush pickup. The crew will only go through the Village one time during that week. If the brush is not out when they go through, you will have to wait until the next brush pickup. In case of large storm events, this schedule may be extended. Scheduled weeks are posted on Biron's website. The last week of the month is determined by the week in which the final day of the month falls.

Biron asks brush/limbs to be placed for collection no later than 7:00 a.m. on Monday of the schedule pick-up week. This will help with gas costs. Brush must be piled in one direction, with cut ends facing the road, and placed near but not on the road. Please limit brush pile to a maximum of 10 feet in length, 4 feet in height, and 6 feet in width. (10'L X 4'H X 6'W) Keep brush pile away from mailboxes, lawn ornaments, streetlights, signs, power poles or any other objects that would prohibit pick up.

Biron brush chipper is limited to brush 6" in diameter. If you have tree limbs, logs, or brush that exceeds that, you will need to dispose of those items yourself. Passes for the City of Wisconsin Rapids compost site are sold at the Village Municipal Center. The pass fee is established by Wisconsin Rapids and allows disposal of lawn waste & brush of any size, as well as access to recycled black dirt/compost.

Biron asks when removing an entire tree, residents contract the services of a professional tree service, and as part of that service to have the entire tree removed. Biron's brush pick-up program is for resident generated brush only, not contracted tree removal or trimming. If removing a smaller tree on your own, please check with the Village of Biron Public Works staff to determine Biron's ability to assist in removing brush and limbs. It is likely the larger portions of the tree, such as the trunk and large limbs, will need to be disposed of by the resident.
