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## The Tilden Code of Ordinances Chapter 21

## Section 6:

For the purpose of emergency vehicle access, the following are highly recommended:

- **A.** The remaining slope of the driveway may have a grade not to exceed 6% upward or down-ward from the roadbed level.
- **B.** Ample width (the equivalent of one standard road lane [eleven (11) feet]) is provided.
- **C.** All obstructions are removed in all directions, including overhead.
- **D.** Retaining walls or drop-offs should be at least four (4) feet from the traveled portion of the driveway.
- **E.** Curves or corners should take into consideration easy access for emergency vehicles.
- **F.** Conditions created by adverse weather, including rain, snow, ice, and heat be considered.

Failure to meet these recommendations may negate your ability to receive emergency services.
