Tax Collection

The Green County Treasurer's office collects Real Estate taxes for the Town of Brooklyn. You may mail your payment or stop by the Green County Courthouse during business hours.

Also accepting payments are the following banks: Bank of New Glarus - Monroe, Belleville, Brodhead, Juda & New Glarus; Lake Ridge Bank - Belleville, Brooklyn & New Glarus; Woodford State Bank - Argyle, Blanchardville, Monroe, New Glarus & South Wayne.

Payments can be made at www.co.green.wi.gov; payments made with a credit card will incur a 2.35% surcharge; debit cards will incur a \$3.95 per transaction charge; and payments made with an e-check will incur a \$1.00 surcharge.

Brooklyn Fire & EMS Update

The Brooklyn Fire and EMS District continues to improve its ability to serve the 3,500 residents in its 47 square mile service area.

Since receiving state approval in 2023, the EMS division has operated with a flex staffing model which allows for a more advanced-level EMS response. Advanced level EMTs can perform more treatment options than the basic level EMT. Currently, 14 of the EMT division staff have taken 180 hours of training and secured their Advanced-level license. The goal is to increase that level again in 2025. A majority of patient transports in Brooklyn Rescue 42 are now attended by Advanced EMTs.

Town Chair's Report


Over the last year, we completed a full reevaluation of all properties. I appreciate everyone's participation. Our levy is now more equally distributed among our residents. We also completed a reconstruction project and sealcoated over 7 miles of roads.

As we look into the next year, I am working with Internet Service Providers to improve the internet within the town. Improving internet for everyone will be a slow process. WisDOT will reconstruct State Highway 92 from Belleville to Brooklyn in 2025. The road will remain open, but slower than normal. The approximately 13-mile project will begin after school is out, in June 2025, and will likely take most of the summer to complete.

Lastly, your opinion counts and we want each of you to be a part of our community. We are looking for volunteers at Fire/EMS Dept. and at the Town Media Center to create bi-annual newsletters, maintain the Town website, or serve as the Town grant writer to apply for State and Federal programs to benefit our community. The Road Report 2024



The Town aims to resurface approximately one mile of road each year. In 2024, the section of Elmer Rd between CTY E and Smith Rd was replaced. This entailed grinding up the existing road deck, followed by regrading and paving with new asphalt. This project was supported in part by a grant from the State of Wisconsin. The Board and Highway Committee remain active in applying for grants whenever possible.

Decisions regarding road work in 2025 will be made after the yearly road tour next April.

Today, many families look for ways to stretch the household budget. A great way to save money is using the Town of Brooklyn Recycling Center. The cost is \$4 per bag for trash and recycling is always free when you drop your items off at our Recycling Center located on Benson Road. This service is available to all Town of Brooklyn residents.

An average family generating two thirty-gallon bags of garbage a week can easily save more than \$500 per year compared to hiring a commercial service. Did you know...?

- As winter approaches, do not push snow across the road and make sure to keep the right-of-way clear of any items. Both can cause hazardous conditions for our snow removal personnel and equipment.
- Ensure your mailbox is properly secure. If your mailbox gets hit by the Town's snowplow, the Town has a policy in place to pay a one-time \$25 reimbursement for a new mailbox. Your box must be physically damaged by the plow, not merely by snow wash. If this happens, please take a photo of the hit box and email it to: clerk@townofbrooklynwi.gov
- WI Stat 174.05 requires owners to annually license a dog older than 5 months. Complete the application and send the fee to Town Treasurer. Application, fees and another information are at www.townofbrooklyn.org/forms-permits/
- Rent the Town Hall for indoor events. There is a full kitchen, two bathrooms, tables, and chairs for your use. The maximum capacity is 100. Residents get a discount on rental fee. Application and costs: www.townofbrooklyn.org/forms-permits/
