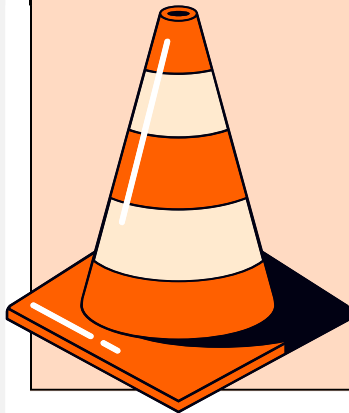
Keep Our Night Skies Bright With Stars

Road Work: Summer 2026

Construction Season is here! Slow down and drive safely!

Road Closure: July 14-Aug 30, 2026 on Highway 69 & CTH- C, in Monticello, for roundabout construction.



Road Work in the Town:

- Reconstruction on King Road.
- Seal-coating on Trow, Amidon, & Zwiefel Roads.
- Legler Road: Dredging and replace three culverts.
- Freidig Road: Replace guardrails & remove a culvert.
- Elmer Road: Replace two culverts near Hwy 104.

Don't Wait & Be Too Late: Clear the Way for Emergency Vehicles

Driveway clearances must be a minimum of 14' tall, and the clear width shall be a minimum of 6' to each side of the driveway surface for a total of 26' wide clearance.

Seconds matter: cut back trees and shrubs!



Don't Cause A Fire!

Lithium and Lithium-ion batteries pose a higher risk of fire, especially if they are left in electronic devices that are damaged or defective. Please remove them from all electronic devices and apply clear packing tape to the terminals before disposing.

Internet Grants: Now & Future

Green County, to include the Town of Brooklyn, was awarded a grant for Fixed Wireless and Low-Orbit Satellite to improve internet speeds and availability. Vendors have until 2030 to use the grant money to build the infrastructure. TDS is completing work on a 2016 grant to provide fiber-to-home service in the southwest portion of the Town, including Attica. Contact TDS for more information.
