

CHAPTER 22 – PARKS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES

Sec. 22-100. Operating of vehicles on public property.

- (a) It shall be unlawful to operate any motorcycle, motor bike, mini-bike, trail bike, ATV, or other similar motorized vehicle in or upon any portion of public land, including, but not limited to, parks, parkways, or open space easements, unless designated as a park drive, roadway, parking area or temporary parking area within such public land, without prior village approval.
- (b) It is prohibited to operate a motor vehicle as listed above in such a manner as to cause damage or destruction to the park land, facilities or parking areas. (See chapter 24, public nuisances.)
- (c) *Penalty.* Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be subject to a forfeiture of \$500 plus damages, per the village fee schedule.

Sec. 22-135. Ownership rights of interment.

- (b) Lot owners may not resell or transfer their lots or parts of lots except as outlined below:
 - (1) The village clerk/treasurer shall enter in the record kept for that purpose all deeds of transfer and reconveyance of cemetery lots.

Sec. 22-139. Interments.

- (a) Interments will be made only during daylight hours unless with prior approval of the public works department.
- (b) All interments shall be made in a permanent outer burial container as defined in § 157.061(11g), Wis. Stats., excluding the use of wood.
- (c) No burial will be permitted until a report for final disposition of a human corpse, or comparable documentation, has been presented to the village clerk/treasurer and a burial form has been completed.
- (d) There will be no responsibility on the part of the village for the protection and maintenance of items used in conjunction with funerals, including, but not limited to, flowers, wreaths, and emblems.
- (e) The interment of two or more bodies, none of which are cremated remains, in one grave will not be allowed, except in special circumstances.
- (f) The interment of four cremated remains may be allowed in one lot. The minimum container requirement for cremated remains shall be as supplied by a crematorium.
- (g) The interment of one body, which is not cremated remains, and one cremated remains may be allowed in one lot.
