

CHAPTER 32 – TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

Sec. 32-22. Enforcement. – DELETE (b) and (c)

(b) Deposit.

- ~~(1) Any person arrested for a violation of this chapter may make a deposit of money at the police station or at the office of the village clerk in person. Deposits may also be mailed to the office of the village clerk. The arresting officer or the person receiving the deposit shall comply with state law or, if the deposit is mailed, the signed statement required shall be mailed with the deposit. The arresting officer or the person receiving the deposit shall notify the arrested person, orally or in writing, that if he fails to appear in court at the time fixed in the citation and if the court does not accept the deposit as a forfeiture, he will be summoned into court to answer the complaint.~~
- ~~(2) The amount of the deposit shall be determined in accordance with the current deposit schedule established by the board of circuit judges.~~
- ~~(3) The arresting officer or the person receiving the deposit shall issue the arrested person a receipt as required by Wis. Stats., Section 345.26(3)(b).~~
- ~~(4) If a deposit schedule has not been established, the arresting officer shall require the alleged offender to deposit not less than the maximum forfeiture permitted under the fees and penalties schedule for this chapter.~~
- ~~(c) *Stipulation of no contest.* Any person charged with a violation of this chapter, except Wis. Stats. Sections 32-346.62(1) and 32-346.63(1), may at the time of the alleged violation or within five days thereafter make a stipulation of no contest pursuant to Wis. Stats., Section 345.27. The person shall at the time of entering into the stipulation make the deposit as required under subsection (b) of this section. A person who has mailed or filed a stipulation under this subsection may, however, appear in court on the appearance date.~~

Sec. 32-113. Bicycle registration requested; identification sticker. DELETE

- ~~(a) Every owner of any bicycle shall be encouraged to file with the police department a complete description of the bicycle; such filing shall constitute a registration for the purpose of this article. The registration shall be serially numbered and kept on file by the police department in its offices as a public record.~~
- ~~(b) Upon registration of a bicycle in the office, the police department shall issue to the owner of the bicycle an identification sticker serially numbered to correspond with the registration of the bicycle. The tag shall be affixed to the bicycle so that it is visible upon inspection. A fee, listed in the fee schedule, shall be charged for the life-time registration of any bicycle under the provisions of this chapter. If the bicycle is sold or junked, the police department should be notified to remove the file.~~

~~(c) The police department personnel shall have the authority to refuse to register any bicycle found to be in unsafe mechanical condition or not equipped as herein required.~~
