

**SECRET BALLOT ELECTION AND
TOWN MEETING WARRANT**

Tuesday, March 31, 2026

and

Saturday April 4, 2026

TO: Amy Hall, Resident of the Town of Steuben, in the County of Washington,

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Steuben, in said county and state, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Office Building on Tuesday the 31st of March, 2026 at 7:45 am, then and there to act upon Article 1 and by secret ballot on Article 2. The polling hours therefore to be from eight o'clock in the morning until eight o'clock in the afternoon.

And, to notify and warn said inhabitants to meet at the Steuben Fire Station on Saturday, the 4th day of April 2026 at 1pm, then and there to act on Articles 3 through 46 as set out below, to wit:

Article 1: To elect a moderator by written ballot to preside at said meeting

Article 2: To elect all municipal officers; One Selectman for a 3-year term, One Overseer for a 3-year term, and One Local Advisory Committee Member for a 3-year term.

The meeting will be recessed at the close of polls at 8 pm on March 31st to reconvene at the Steuben Fire Station at 1 pm on Saturday, April 4th for the purpose of voting on the following articles:

Article 3: Shall the following amendment to the General Assistance Ordinance be enacted?
Appendices (A thru H) 2025-2026

Article 4: Shall the following amendment to the Town's Shellfish Conservation Ordinance be enacted?
The first paragraph of Section 8 is amended to read: "All commercial license applicants will be required to complete conservation time, including but not limited to, reseeding and brushing projects, shellfish surveys and attending conservation committee meetings. Conservation time needs to be completed each year to be eligible for a Commercial Shellfish License in the upcoming year. The amount of conservation time which includes committee meetings and flat work will be regulated by the Selectmen upon recommendation from the Shellfish Committee."



- Article 36:** To see if the Town will vote that a taxpayer who pays an amount in excess of that finally assessed shall be repaid the amount of the overpayment plus interest from the date of the overpayment, at the annual rate of **4.5%**, pursuant to Title 36 § 506-A.

- Article 37:** To see if the town will vote to authorize the municipal officers to spend an amount not to exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of the budgeted amount in each budget category of the 2026 annual budget during the period from January 1, 2027, to the 2027 annual town meeting.

- Article 38:** To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell unused equipment or other items with an estimate cash value of less than \$500 after advertising a public sale.

- Article 39:** To see if the town will vote to have unexpended balances in the Town Accounts at the end of the year carried forward in the same account.

- Article 40:** To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and/or accept and expend, on behalf of the Town, money from Federal, State and other governmental units or private sources which may be received, from time to time in the form of Grants or any other source, during the period of April 4, 2026, until the next annual Town Meeting.


