## NOTICE OF RECALL ELECTION AND SAMPLE BALLOT

### APRIL 22, 2025

OFFICE OF THE WRIGHTSTOWN COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT CLERK TO THE VOTERS OF THE WRIGHTSTOWN COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT:

Notice is hereby given of a recall election for the Wrightstown Community School District School Board to be held in several wards and towns in the Wrightstown Community School District on April 22, 2025, at 7:00 am - 8:00 pm which the officers named below shall be nominated. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, in the sample ballot below.

#### **Information to Voters**

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
  - show an acceptable form of photo identification\*
  - sign the poll book\*\*
- ⇒ **If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.**
- ⇒ **\*If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**
- ⇒ **\*\*If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word “exempt.”** Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a voting machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth for referral. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

#### **Assistance for Voting**

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

#### **Where Optical Scan Voting is Used**

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which he or she intends to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line.

When using an electronic ballot marking device (“ExpressVote”) to mark an optical scan ballot, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote.

If a voter spoils an optical scan or touch screen ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

#### **After Voting the Ballot**

After an official optical scan or touch screen ballot is marked, it may be placed in a provided security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter shall insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

**Notice to Voters:** If you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initialed by two election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initialed by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials. (See end of ballot for initials).
