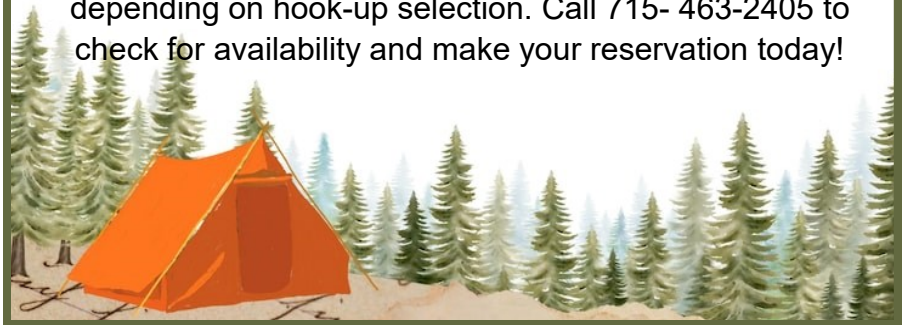

## REPORT NUISANCE BEARS!

Please report all nuisance bears to USDA-Wildlife Services in Rhinelander 1-800-228-1368. Keep garbage and recycling containers in your garage or secured building until pick-up day. Remove all bird feeders and wildlife feed by the middle of April. By working together to reduce/eliminate food sources, we can discourage bears from coming into the Village.

## HELP KEEP OUR STREETS CLEAN!

Debris and other litter that are in the streets are often washed down the storm sewers and eventually find their way to Memory Lake, the St. Croix River, and our watersheds. The Public Works Crew utilizes a street sweeper to gather some of the debris to minimize the amount that is washed down the storm sewers. Please do your part, too, and keep streets, alleys, and gutters near your home or business free of leaves, grass clippings, twigs, branches, or litter to limit the amount of unwanted debris in our waterways.

## SPRING HYDRANT FLUSHING



The Public Works Crew will be flushing fire hydrants in April. Hydrant flushing is necessary to make sure adequate flow and pressure is available and to remove sediment from the pipes.

Occasionally, water may become discolored after hydrant flushing. If this happens, run your cold water tap for a few minutes until the water clears. If the water does not clear the first time, wait a few minutes, and run the water again. Avoid washing clothes until the water clears. If you have questions or concerns, please contact the Public Works Department.
