316 Freeman St | The Old Ford Garage–

316 Freeman St. became the Ford Garage when in 1929, B.J., Jr.* and Lotta* Bill purchased the existing auto company that had been in business since 1919, from B.F. Schuren* and J.M. Luther*. In August 1938, the business was sold to B.J. Bill III* and Theron C. Bill* after Mr. Bill's passing. Although a licensed Ford Dealership, the garage fixed all makes and models. 316 Freeman was the location for Knoll Tools, manufacturer of side windows for sport cars, for many years following the dealership. Before the fire that took the building on December 23rd, 2020, it was most recently K&M Auto Body, where owner, Mark Tobias, restored old cars similar to those that were once sold and worked on at this location through the 1950's.
