Community Rivers Program: The Community Rivers Program is striving to improve water health and quality within the Upper Milwaukee River Watershed by working together with local residents, elected municipal officials, and community organizations to inspire, inform, and engage residents with and about the Milwaukee River in their own communities.

Keep those autumn leaves off the ground and from entering your storm drains!

As Fall approaches and leaves begin falling off of trees, please be mindful of how you are getting rid of this "leaf litter". Leaves that are washed or raked into our storm drains will negatively impact the Milwaukee River as the nutrients, phosphorus and nitrogen, break down and contribute to the depletion of oxygen in water. The village will be conducting street cleaning/ sweeping and leaf collections this November, but in the meantime, there are several things you can do with your leaves:



- Bag leaves and tuck them away somewhere until spring.
- Mow over fallen leaves in your yard for added nutrients.
- Put fallen leaves into a compost bin or pile.

Dept. of Public Works

The DPW maintains 13 miles of roadway, 5 parks, and 3 facilities. We operate with a crew responsible for snow plowing, brush chipping, road repair, and parks and building maintenance. To reach us, email: dpw@village.newburg.wi.us or call (262) 689-5960.

Bulk Item Drop-Off

Bulk Item Collection is going on now, each Saturday in October from 9am to Noon. This is a great opportunity to dispose of large items like old furniture. The following items can not be accepted: appliances, tires, electronics, or wet paint.

Leaf Collection

Curb-side leaf collection will be the week of November 8th. Leaves should be placed on the curb or on the gravel shoulder no later than 6am on November 8th. Leaf piles must be free of sticks, but may contain plant and grass clippings.

Piles should not be placed in the ditches; our equipment may not reach the piles if you put the leaves in a ditch.

Collection will begin on November 8th and may take a few days to complete and will be dependent on the weather. If you don't see your leaves picked up right away, please give us until November 15th to finish the Village's route.

Snowplowing Reminder

Park on alternate sides of the street between 11pm and 6am. Snow piles should not be pushed into the roadway.

Village staff are not able to be responsible for driveways receiving snow from plowing the road. Snow operations may take multiple passes through which may result in driveways being filled with snow multiple times during a snow event. We appreciate your understanding.

The Village does not maintain a "bare roads" policy. This means that there may be some times when roads have snow on them. Village staff will do their best to make roads passable and safe during snow events. Travelers are urged to use caution and plan ahead when traveling on snowy roadways.



Christmas Trees

After the holidays when you are ready to dispose of your Christmas Tree, please know that we can help you. The DPW Recycling Center, located at the north end of Municipal Drive, will be open on January 8th and 22nd from 9am to Noon to accept your tree.



Trash & Recycling Pick-Up

We are very sorry for the late trash and recycling pick-ups that residents experienced the last couple of months. Our vendor - Waste Management, has been experiencing staffing issues that have caused the delay. We believe that the pick-up routine is now back on track. However, should you ever notice that your bins have not been emptied timely, please LEAVE THEM AT THE CURB, and this will signal to our staff and our contractor that there is still work to be done. You will not be ticketed or penalized for leaving your cart out if the trash company has not yet been around to empty it.

Dog Waste in the Parks

Newburg does not have a "No dogs in the parks" rule because we understand that your furry friends are part of the family and part of having a nice community means being able to recreate with pets. We have provided doggy-poo-pickup-bags in our parks and trash cans for disposal. We regret to report that some parks visitors are not responsibly cleaning up after their dogs. Please pick up after your dog and politely encourage your neighbors to do the same.

We have full time and part-time work in the Department of Public Works performing duties such as snow plowing, leaf collection, road patching, recycling oversight, and water testing.

Minimum Qualifications: Competent at driving and using small machinery such as snow blower and lawn mower. Willingness to work in all types of weather. Careful and follows directions.

Schedule is extremely versatile but generally first shift weekday work, some Saturdays, and variable depending on snowfall. "Just snowplowing duties" is also an option. Compensation is \$16-\$22 per hour plus a snowplowing premium.

A Message from the Police Chief

I hope everyone had a nice and safe summer. It is nice to see that the road construction on West Main Street, Carmody Court and Hawthorne Drive are all complete. We receive a lot of speeding complaints in those areas so please watch your speeds. I am sure most of the Village residents have seen our new speed sign posted in the Village. We will be periodically changing the location of the speed sign to other Village streets where we have had the most complaints of speeders. We will also welcome requests if we are able to find a post to affix it to.

I would like to remind Newburg residents that our winter parking restrictions will be in effect starting November 1st. We have the odd/even system in the village where parking is permitted. If you choose to park on the street, your vehicle must be on the side of the street that matches the calendar date before midnight. This means that if you are parking early in the morning, between midnight and 6am, you need to consider yesterday's date for the prior evening. When the evening date is odd, park on the odd side of the street; and park on the even side of the street for even dates. The village also has a 48-hour parking provision:

Forty-Eight Hour Parking Prohibited: No person shall park a vehicle, nor shall any owner of a vehicle permit a vehicle to be parked on Main St. or in any village owned lots for a period longer than 48 consecutive hours without the vehicle being moved at least 12 feet. In other words, if there is a reason you need to leave your vehicle in a municipal lot or on Main St. for more than two days, please give the police department a call so we can discuss what might be going on. We like to work with our residents and hear from you if there is an issue with a vehicle or there are extenuating circumstances that may prevent you from moving your vehicle.



As always, if you have any questions, please contact me or stop in to the police department. I can be reached at (262) 675-9360 (non-emergency, please leave a message.) The police department will be out and about during Trick or Treat on October 30th. We hope to see you!

P.S. In case of an emergency, please call 911. If you need non-emergency assistance, but cannot leave a message, you can speak with someone right away by calling the Washington County Sheriff's Office at 262-335-4378 or Ozaukee County Sheriff's Office at 262-284-7172. If you have an issue that can wait such as a traffic complaint, ordinance violation, or animal complaint please contact the Newburg Police directly.

Special Assistance for Village Evacuation (SAVE)

Would you or someone you know need help evacuating if there were ever a major emergency in the village? Our Emergency Management Team is interested in identifying people in the village who, in the event of an emergency, may need special assistance evacuating to safety. For example - a deaf person who may not hear directions or sirens, or a person dependent upon electrical medical machines. This information identifying people with special needs in our community will allow either law enforcement or the fire department to be sure that all people within any designated evacuation area are safely removed.



If you wish to have someone in your household included in our list, which will be provided to emergency response teams that service our village, please contact Village Hall to to provide the name of the person, year of birth, address, and any special notes about the assistance that could be needed. Welcome, House of Modification Examples, Inc. (Welcome HOME)

At Welcome, House Of Modification Examples, Inc. - Welcome HOME - summer passed by much too quickly, again!

The mission of Welcome HOME is quite simple —" Enrich the lives of individuals and families living with disability". This unique non-profit all volunteer organization (the program has had no paid staff since day one in 1989) accomplishes this goal using a variety of avenues.

One way is by providing wheelchair friendly grounds with trails through an inviting prairie and woodland. Who doesn't enjoy a relaxing stroll – by foot or by chair? We invite you to come amble along the trails. (Sorry, no dogs allowed). With leaves falling this is a good time of year to count how many nests you see in the trees.

Another life enrichment tool Welcome HOME uses is individualized tours (by appointment) of the wheelchair-friendly house where you'll see varied accessible designs. There is no typical or the average disabled person so it is important to design your home to meet your capabilities and needs. Bring your camera, builder, designer - we have the tape measure. Our ideas are for sharing. Due to the Covid lifestyle we are spending more time sharing accessible design ideas via computer and phone. While photos and measurements are not the same as being able to actually interact with multiple home designs, it's a good start.

One wing of the house (2 bedrooms and bathrooms) is a Bed and Breakfast. Lodging is open to all – no disability required to be our guest. A quiet get-away from the routine of life enriches anyone. This lodging option also gives folks interested in exploring accessible designs the opportunity to interact with the ideas found throughout the house to determine what may (or just as importantly, may not) work best for them.

Awareness of what living with a disability entails enriches to world for all of us. These Girl Scouts are learning by doing – sweeping the floor while mobile via manual wheelchair, putting together a puzzle with eyes damaged by macular degeneration, putting on winter clothes without being able to stand or move your legs. Let us know if your group would like to participate in a "Life With Disability" hand's-on exercise.


