

Bring: Prescription (controlled and non-controlled) and over-the-counter medications, ointments, inhalers, patches, non-aerosol sprays, creams, vape cartridges and devices (with batteries removed), vials and pet medications.

Do Not Bring: Illegal drugs, needles/sharps, mercury thermometers, aerosol cans, biohazardous materials (anything containing a bodily fluid or blood), flares, personal care products (shampoo, soaps, lotions, sunscreens, etc...), household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, chemicals, oil, or gas), acids or any vape devices containing batteries of any kind.

- This program is anonymous and all efforts should be made to protect the anonymity of individuals disposing of medications. No questions or requests for identification, including proof of residency should be made.

Participants may dispose of solid, non-liquid medication(s) by keeping them in the plastic pill bottle or removing the medication from its container and disposing of it directly into a disposal box or into a clear sealable plastic bag. It is recommended that recycling bins are provided at the collection sites for disposal of such containers. If turning over in the plastic pill bottle, individuals should be encouraged to remove any identifying information from the prescription label. Blister packages are acceptable without the medications being removed.

- Liquids will be accepted during this initiative. However, the liquids, creams and sprays must be in their original packaging and evenly distributed within the boxes of collected solid prescription medications. Liquids without the original packaging will not be accepted.
