



## **Resolution 2024-07**

### **RESOLUTION REQUIRING THE REPAIR OF AN AT-GRADE RAILROAD CROSSING**

**WHEREAS**, a public street in the Town of Grafton, Ozaukee County crosses the tracks of the Chicago & North Western Railway at-grade; and

**WHEREAS**, section 86.12 of the Wisconsin Statutes requires a railroad company to maintain public at-grade crossings in good condition and repair for public travel; and


**WHEREAS**, the pavement on the East and West sides of the crossing has caved in and the railroad ties are protruding at the intersection, meaning the crossing is no longer in safe condition and in proper repair for public travel and maintenance; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Grafton hereby requests that Chicago & North Western Railway pave, plank, repair, change or otherwise improve the crossing, as the needs require.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Supervisors of the Town of Grafton, Ozaukee County, hereby directs the Town Clerk to serve a copy of this Resolution upon the Chicago & North Western Railway requiring the railroad to repair the at-grade crossing at State Highway 60 with the tracks of the Chicago & North Western Railway in the Town of Grafton, Ozaukee County.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that in the event that the Chicago & North Western Railway fails to repair the at-grade crossing within 30 days after service of this Resolution, the Board of Supervisors of the Town of Grafton hereby directs the Town Clerk to take all necessary steps to petition the Office of the Commissioner of Railroads for an investigation and order for the repair of the at-grade crossing of State Highway 60 with the tracks of the Chicago & North Western Railway in the Town of Grafton, Ozaukee County.
