Title 6 – Health and Sanitation, Chapter 5 – Firearms (1983 Revised) Section 6.5.1.01 Title 6 – Chapter 5 – Page 2 of 5 Amended Through Town of Grafton Ordinance 2014-04 6.5.1 Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to regulate, restrict, and prohibit the discharge of firearms in the Town to protect the safety, health and welfare of the residents the Town of Grafton and their property.

6.5.1.01 Definitions

(A) Firearms. For purposes of this ordinance the term "firearms" shall mean all weapons used for the purpose of propelling bullets, shot or other missiles, whether from cartridge, shell or other container, by explosives or compressed air, and shall include all forms of shot guns, rifles, revolvers and other similar types of equipment.

6.5.1.02 Described Area

That area in the Town of Grafton which is densely populated is described as follows: "Commencing at the intersection of the center lines of River Bend Road and County Trunk Hwy. "T" (Lakefield Road) then Westerly along the center line of County Trunk Hwy. "T" to the Eastern bank of the Milwaukee River, then Southerly along said Eastern bank of the Milwaukee River to the intersection of the Milwaukee River with the center line of County Trunk Hwy. "C" (Pioneer Road) then Westerly along the center line of County Trunk Hwy. "C" to the Western boundary of the Town of Grafton, which is legally described as the west SW and NW '4 Section 36 Section Lines, then Northerly along this Section Line to the west SW '4 Section 25 Section Line, then northerly along this Section Line to the Southern jurisdictional limits of the Village of Grafton, then Easterly along these limits to the center line of 17th Avenue, then Southerly along the center line of 17th Avenue to the center line of River Bend Road, then Easterly and Southerly following the center line of River Bend Road to the place of beginning, specifically excluding those properties in the City of Cedarburg which are located within the area described above and depicted on the map attached hereto as "Exhibit A."

6.5.1.03 Prohibitions

- (A) Discharge Prohibited. No person shall discharge, attempt to discharge, or cause to be discharged, any firearm within the Town of Grafton within 150 yards of the residence or dwelling of another or within the area described in Section 6.5.1.02. This prohibition shall not apply to the discharge of a firearm for the purpose of controlling agricultural pests by the owner or lessee of lands within the Town of Grafton on premises owned or leased by such owner or lessee.
- (B) Restrictions. In addition to the prohibition of Section 6.5.1.03(A), no person shall discharge, attempt to discharge, or cause to be discharged any firearm within the corporate limits of the Town of Grafton outside the area described in Section 6.5.1.02, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance. **Title 6 Health and Sanitation, Chapter 5 Firearms (1983 Revised)** Section 6.5.1.04 Title 6 Chapter 5 Page 3 of 5 Amended Through Town of Grafton Ordinance 2014-04

6.5.1.04 Exceptions

The following are exceptions to Sections 6.5.1.03(A) and 6.5.1.03(B) of this ordinance:

- (A) When a firearm is being used by a law enforcement officer in the lawful performance of his duty;
- (B) When a firearm is necessary to protect the personal property of one carrying such firearm or the personal property of another, in compliance with state law;
- (C) When the discharge of firearms is on navigable waters which are located outside the area described in Section 6.5.1.02.

6.5.1.05 Permits Required

The owner or lessee of lands located within the Town, members of the owner's or lessee's immediate family, and such persons to whom the owner or lessee may issue written permits, may discharge firearms upon such lands actually owned or leased, provided, that such lands are not within the area described Section 6.5.1.02, and subject to the following restrictions:

- (A) That the discharge of firearms shall be so controlled that the bullet, shot or missile propelled there from shall not pass over or on the premises of another or upon the public highway or other public grounds.
- (B) That the discharge of firearms shall be controlled so as not to endanger the life or property of another.
- (1) The permits described in this section may be granted only by owners or lessees of land located within the Town of Grafton. These permits may be purchased at the office of the Town Clerk at a cost determined by the Town Board and must be countersigned by an official of the Town. These permits shall be executed in triplicate, with the original remaining with the Town Clerk, one copy provided to the owner or lessee of the land granting such permit and one copy provided to the person to whom such permit is issued. These permits shall provide for an expiration date not to exceed 120 days from the date of issuance thereof; the permit issued to any person shall be revoked immediately upon a finding that such person has violated any section of this ordinance.

6.5.1.06 Permit Must Be Carried

Any person discharging a firearm on land not owned or leased by such person shall have his or her permit in his or her immediate possession and shall display the same upon demand from any Town official or law enforcement officer.

6.5.1.07 Penalty

Anyone violating any provision of this ordinance shall forfeit the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for each offense and shall in addition, pay the cost of prosecution. In default of payment of the forfeiture provided in this section, any person who has been found to violate this ordinance shall be confined to the County jail until such forfeiture with costs has been paid; such period of confinement shall not exceed 30 days.
