Tax Collection and Dog Licensing

Taxes are accepted any time by mail or by using the drop box at the hall. Taxes can be paid by check only and should be made payable to: Village of Cascade. No change will be handled at the hall. If your escrow check is in excess of your tax bill, a refund will be mailed to the taxpayer within 10 days.

All dogs over the age of 5 months must be licensed! A license requires submission of breed, sex, name, color, and proof of current rabies vaccination. Receipts, tags and vaccination papers will be mailed back to you. Landlords please advise your tenants to license dogs kept on your property. Please keep in mind that by Village ordinance a property may only license up to 3 dogs.

So here we are getting ready to embrace another Wisconsin winter! With that in mind please help out where you can in clearing fire hydrants in the Village near your home! The hydrants in the Village are spaced approximately 600ft apart and in a structure fire situation the fire department may need to use more than one hydrant!

Hopefully you have checked and cleaned your smoke/ fire alarms and Carbon Monoxide detectors and have updated them if they are older than 7 years old! There are some out now that will last 10 years so it is a good idea to date them before you install them and be sure to keep ice and snow away from any vents that exhaust your furnaces and hot water heaters as well!

Also, please be sure to check ice conditions before venturing out on the lakes and rivers for any winter activities


One last reminder- please be sure to work with your children on their home address and phone numbers
