

Dog Licensing

Dog licenses for 2020 were due by March 31st, 2020! All dog license renewals are now considered late and require a \$10 late fee in addition to normal licensing costs; \$8.00 spayed/ neutered dogs or \$15.00 non-spayed/non-neutered dogs.

Please get in contact with the Treasurer or Clerk to provide all required information and payment to renew your dog's license. All information and payment may be dropped in the Village Hall Drop Box at 301 First St or mailed to PO Box 157 Cascade, WI 53011. If you no longer have a dog or have a different dog please contact us with that information also.

Failure to license your dog is a violation of Ordinance No. 3



of 1990, Requiring Licensing and limiting the number of dogs per household in the Village of Cascade. Violation of this ordinance could result in a penalty of up to \$50 per day you are not in compliance in addition to any court costs.

away due to inability to pay. This service is being provided by Sheboygan County Senior Dining Program.


Village-wide Turbine Survey Results
