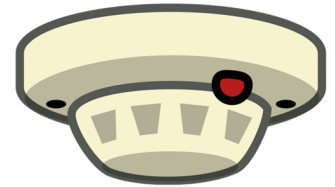
## Important Information

Hello Village of Cascade Residents. It has been a very busy year for the Police Department. We have had some recent changes in our organization. As we move into October, I would like to remind everyone that October 15, 2022, is National Move Over Day. You will see social media and probably TV ads talking about the Move Over Law. The law is covered under statute 346.072. The law requires drivers to shift lanes or slowdown in order to provide a safety zone for a squad car, ambulance, fire truck, tow truck, utility vehicle, or highway maintenance vehicle that is stopped on the side of the road with its warning lights flashing. October is also Halloween. Please remember that when the Village celebrates with trick-or-treat hours, there are lots of families and children walking on some of the roadways throughout the Village. Please take time if you need to go somewhere and drive with caution. As has been the practice, the police department will be out during the Halloween Celebration.

The Utility Board has approved the acceptance of credit cards for payment of utility bills!

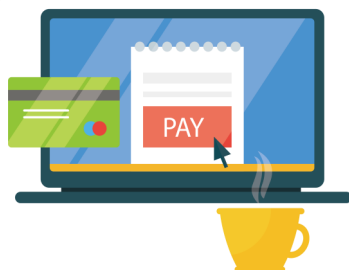
Using UB-Pay customers are able to create an online account to view bills and pay your bill online with a credit card or e-check.
