Cascade Water Utility in Process of Adding a Second Well

Dear Residents,

As you are aware we have been working on building a second well for the Village.

A previous test well was drilled in the north-east corner of Village and found to be inadequate in water quality. A third test well has been drilled near the mill pond, and this is the site we will be developing.


The Wisconsin DNR has indicated a requirement to secure a second source of water for the Village, and we have been working toward that end for several years. In 2020 the Village signed an agreement with SEH, Inc. for the following;

- Well Design & Permitting
- Well House and Site Design
- Bidding Services
- Well Construction Phase Services

They are also helping with Securing Loans and Grants From SDW (Safe Drinking Water Loan).

Construction, installation and commissioning of the new well are expected to be started in January, 2023 with completion by end of March, 2024 or later dependent on weather.

There will be an impact on the water portion of bills due to this necessary second well construction. Design and bidding have not been completed yet, and we will update you as firm numbers, and loan repayment costs are finalized.

Online Bill Pay Option for Utility Bills





We recently started our community engagement page, which can be found at the following address <https://cityprotect.com/agency/capd>. From this webpage, you can file a police report, request records, file a non-emergency police request and submit a tip to Crimestoppers. There will also be a crime map in place in the near future where you can see some of the activity that is taking place throughout the community. City Protect also allows citizens to register cameras. If you have a Ring doorbell or exterior cameras that capture activity, you can register them on our page. If we have a call in or around your house, we will be notified that your camera may have caught information or images relating to the incident. We would then reach out to you and ask if you would give a copy of the footage. Registering a camera only documents its existence and you are not providing any footage or links to view from the registration page. If you have any questions please let me know.

As a final note, I would like remind everyone the Village does have a winter parking ordinance. The ordinance advises that there is no parking on Village streets between 2 am - 6 am. This is in place to allow for proper snow removal. If vehicles are parked on village streets during the above times, they can receive a parking citation for violating the ordinance. 
