New Garbage Recycling Collection Schedule for 2024 and other information

The last day for Waste Management Garbage collection is **Friday December 29th**. Please be sure to leave your carts by the curb so that they can remove them the same day.

Harter's will begin service Monday January 1st 2024. Due to the holiday the first pickup of trash and recycling will be **Tuesday January 2nd**. Please be sure to have your carts to the curb by 6am on collection day.

The Village has moved to every other week recycling, you will find the schedule on the Village website, villageofcascadewi.gov, you also should have received a paper copy as a cart hanger.

Tax Collection and Dog Licensing

In Person Tax Collection will be Monday's from 12pm -3pm ending January 29th (no collection January 1st)

Taxes are accepted any time by mail or by using the drop box at the Village Hall. Taxes can be paid by check only and should be made payable to: Village of Cascade. If your escrow check is in excess of your tax bill, a refund will be mailed to the taxpayer within 10 days. **Taxes will be accepted at the Village Hall until 1/31/2024. After that payments must go to Sheboygan County Treasurers Office.**

All dogs over the age of 5 months must be licensed! A license requires submission of breed, sex, name, color, and proof of current rabies vaccination. Receipts, tags and vaccination papers will be mailed back to you. Landlords please advise your tenants to license dogs kept on your property. **Please keep in mind that by Village ordinance a property may only license up to 3 dogs.**

Online Bill Pay Option for Utility Bills

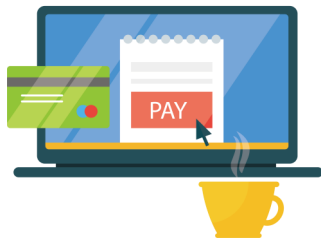
The Utility Board has approved the acceptance of credit cards for payment of utility bills!

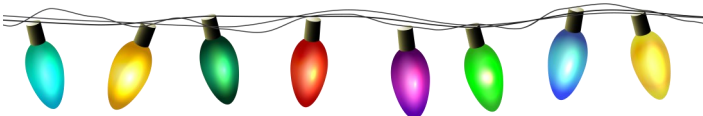


Cascade Police Department

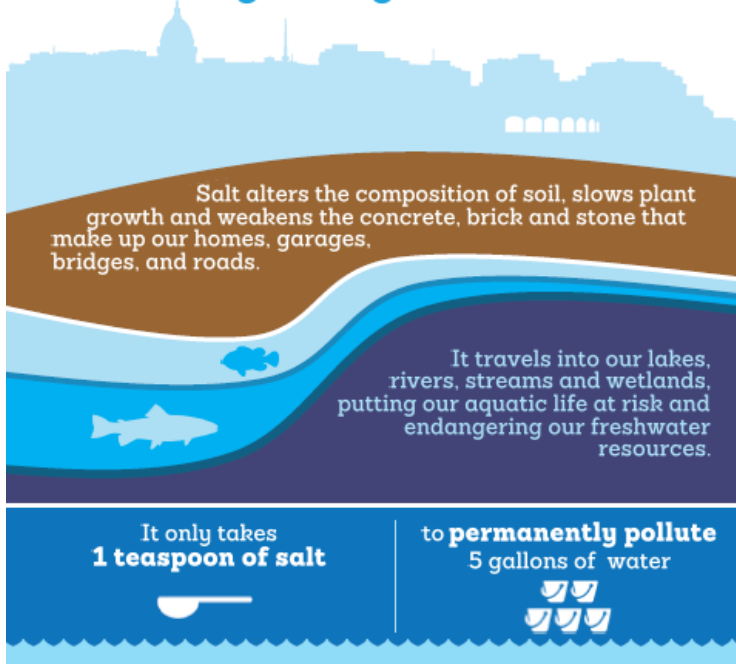

**Once you put salt down,
it doesn't go away**



Every year, we use about...

30,000 tons
Dane County

650,000 tons
Wisconsin

... of salt on our roads

This doesn't include what we use on sidewalks, driveways, and parking lots.

Reduce your salt use to help protect our lakes, streams, and drinking water.

1. Shovel



Clear walkways and other areas before the snow turns to ice. The more snow you remove manually, the less salt you will have to use and the more effective it will be.

2. Scatter



If you use salt, scatter it so that there is space between the grains. Believe it or not, a coffee mug of salt is enough to treat an entire 20-foot driveway or 10 sidewalk squares.

3. Switch



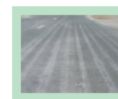
When pavement temperatures drop below 15 degrees, salt won't work. Switch to sand for traction or a different ice melter that works at lower temperatures.

4. Select a Certified Applicator



Encourage your maintenance professional to get certified through the City of Madison's Winter Salt Certification Program and ask businesses in your community to do the same.

5. Love the Lines



Stripes on roads before a storm are anti-icing. They show that your professional maintenance crew is concerned about safety and is saving money, time and protecting our environment!

6. Be Salt Wise All Year



Water softener salt ends up in local freshwater bodies. If your household softener uses more than 1 bag of salt per month, have a professional tune it up or replace it with a high-efficiency model.

Safe winter driving is as easy as 1-2-3:



1. Wait
Wait to allow time for plowing and deicers.



2. Know
Know the current road conditions before you hit the road.



3. Slow
Travel slowly, and use caution and reason.
