Property Tax Information, Dog Licensing and In Person Collection Dates

Taxes are accepted any time by mail or by using the drop box at the Village Hall. Taxes can be paid by check only and should be made payable to: Village of Cascade. If your escrow check is in excess of your tax bill, a refund will be mailed to the taxpayer within 10 days.

All dogs over the age of 5 months must be licensed! A license requires submission of breed, sex, name, color, and proof of current rabies vaccination. Receipts, tags and vaccination papers will be mailed back to you. Landlords please advise your tenants to license dogs kept on your property. **Please keep in mind that by Village ordinance a property may only license up to 3 dogs.**


Cascade Fire Department

First off the Cascade Fire Department would like to say THANKS for all your support in 2025, it doesn't go unnoticed and is appreciated.

With October just around the corner, we would like to stress the importance of taking some time to work with your kids about fire safety, including the danger of matches, exit drills in the home (EDITH), phone numbers and addresses- they seem simple but when stress is up simple things become difficult. If you haven't done so already, take a video of your home inside and out to document items if something happens you don't forget anything that may be lost. Check and clean your smoke and CO detectors, don't forget to date them when installing them. A good rule of thumb is a detector is good for about 7 years.

Lastly- check the front of your homes or apartment buildings, is your address easy to see from the road, do you have working yard lights- these are some things that can be done to make it easier to find you if you need us.

Hello Village Residents from your Village Police Department. We hope everyone had a wonderful summer and we are sure everyone is happy that Madison Avenue is back open. 2025 is starting to wind down and a few things from the Police Department. Trick or Treating is coming up on Oct. 25th, please remember that if you are out and about, please drive slowly and watch for children running out into the road. We see a significant increase in pedestrian traffic during the hours of 3-6 pm and we want everyone to enjoy the activity. Watch for the Cascade Police Department Squad, which will be handing out treats to the kids.

The Health and Relief Committee has sent out letters to approximately 60 residences throughout the Village regarding ordinance violations such as excessive weeds to unsightly debris and unregistered vehicles. A large majority of these have been taken care of, however there are a few properties that have not addressed the issues raised. Those who do not address the ordinance violations may be subject to a fine that includes court costs.
