Property Tax Information, Dog Licensing and In Person Collection Dates

Taxes are accepted any time by mail or by using the drop box at the Village Hall. Taxes can be paid by check only and should be made payable to: Village of Cascade. If your escrow check is in excess of your tax bill, a refund will be mailed to the taxpayer within 10 days. First installments are due to the Village by January 31st. After that payments must be made to the Sheboygan County Treasurer.

Dog licenses expire on March 31st! Any dogs being re-licensed after may be required to pay a late fee(\$10) in addition to licensing fees. All dogs over the age of 5 months must be licensed. A license requires submission of breed, sex, name, color, and proof of current rabies vaccination. Receipts, tags and vaccination papers will be mailed back to you. Landlords please advise your tenants to license dogs kept on your property.

Please keep in mind that by Village ordinance a property may only license up to 3 dogs. |



This winter has already been crazy with the amount of snowfall. Please remember that the Village does have a winter parking ordinance that prohibits parking on Village streets between **2 am and 6 am**. If you are parked on the street, you risk a parking citation.

Also, this is a reminder that dog licenses are required to be purchased between January 1st and March 31st for any dogs older than 5 months. As soon as your dog reaches six months, you are required to license the dog. Please remember that the Village Treasurer will need a current rabies certificate to renew/license a dog.

As of December 1st, Calvin Smith started as our newest officer and Lina Warrens resigned. Please give Calvin a big Cascade welcome when you see him.

In 2025, the Village was committed improving the appearance of the Village and creating an excellent community environment. Some property's received letters regarding different ordinance violations. Many were addressed and corrected, we appreciate it.

In 2026, we will continue the work started in 2025. Those who do not address their violations may receive ordinance citations and/or the Village may correct the issue and add a special assessment to your taxes. Please do not disregard the notices and if you have questions reach out to the Village about the letters.

Village Snow Removal and Plowing Policy

The Village of Cascade has contracted Sheboygan County to plow and salt the Village streets. This does not include alleys.

The Village DPW will plow alleys and cul-de-sacs after the County has made their first pass through town and after each additional pass the County makes.

All salting will be done by the County. The DPW may salt troubled areas as needed.

The Village Board has adopted a 4-inch rule regarding holidays and weekends. If a snow event greater than 4 inches occurs on a weekend or holiday the DPW will be in after the county makes their initial pass. If a snow event is less than 4 inches on a weekend or holiday the DPW will come on the next business day (Monday-Friday).

The Village President and/or Director of Public Works can amend the policy to accommodate weather changes such as temperatures and future snow falls.

No snow should be pushed into a pile which will impede the vision of any person crossing or entering any street intersection while driving or walking.

No snow shall be piled within 100 feet of any intersection on any village street.

DPW will start to remove snow from curb pan as time allows. This typically will be within three business days after a major snow event.

No resident or business shall blow, shovel or plow snow on to any Village street.

DPW will not remove snow from privately owned parking lots.



Winter Safety Tip: Prevent Cold Exposure and Hypothermia

Cold temperatures can quickly lead to hypothermia, especially when wind, moisture, or prolonged outdoor exposure are involved. Dress in layers, starting with a moisture-wicking base layer, followed by insulating layers, and a wind- and water-resistant outer layer. Cover exposed skin, including hands, feet, ears, and face, and change out of wet clothing as soon as possible. Limit time outdoors in extreme cold, take frequent breaks in warm shelter, and watch for early warning signs such as uncontrollable shivering, confusion, slurred speech, or extreme fatigue. If hypothermia is suspected, get the person indoors, remove wet clothing, warm them gradually, and call 911.
